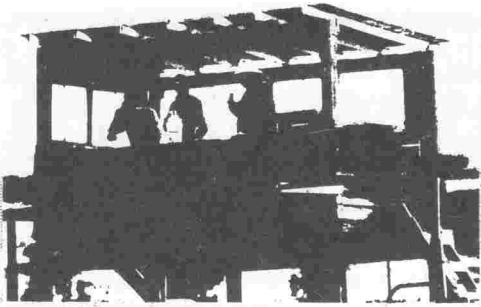

# From the Crow's Nest



The games people play.

One of the most dominant games in our lives completed the 1986 NRA season on Labor Day weekend. The summer was characterized by hordes of contestants, then not so many contestants, and finally, fewer contestants. The loyal fans didn't give up, however, and turned out in good numbers to watch their favorite spectator sport.

And now the top three in the standings in each event are preparing for the NARC-sponsored World Finals Rodeo in El Paso, Texas, and a chance to compete for astronomical amounts of money against the top cowboys from 25 other rodeo associations.

Much has been said about the "crossover" of PRCA and NRA cowboys into each other's associations, and there was a lot of juggling and conniving and finagling to accomplish that crossover. Some were able to "play the game" and others weren't. Most didn't care.

Loyalists to the regional rodeo concept resent it when some so-called "pro" calls them an "amie." "Amie" has a derogatory connotation to it somehow. You can't tell by looking who is a "pro" and who is an "amie," for they all wear cowboy cut Wranglers, roper boots, Dee Pickett style hats, carry rope bags or gear bags, and chew snoose.

But, you can tell by the way they act. An "amie" has nerve enough to ask a committee, or secretary, or stock contractor to change his order or day of appearance, and the "amie" committee, secretary, or stock contractor is one who goes along with the request, or takes entries for the rodeo right up to rodeo time, disregarding the rules of the "game." An "amie" rodeo is one which makes sure the top cowboys get the top stock. An "amie" rodeo is one that forgets that the fans are paying lots of money to see a "show" and that the cowboys are mere "characters in the play," much like a Broadway production, only dirtier. The money the fans pay to see them is vital to the continuance of the rodeo.

This is not to say that many PRCA-sanctioned rodeos are not "amie" or that many

NRA-sanctioned rodeos are not "pro." The adjective describes the attitude which prevails around the rodeo; the atmosphere can be either "pro" or "amie" no matter who sanctions the rodeo, or even if it is not approved by any association.

If NRA rodeo has a reputation of being "amie," that's your fault — members, committees, secretaries, judges, stock contractors. If that blatant disregard for rules prevails around you, that's your fault. If the conniving, juggling, finagling continues, that's also your fault.

Life is a state of mind. If you think things are bad, they are. If you think life is hectic, it is. If you think you're unhappy, you are. If you think everyone's picking on you, they are. If you think the world is too much, it is. If you think you're a loser, you are. But, if you think you're a winner, you are.

The big winners in the game of life sometimes are not the biggest, strongest or smartest. They're the people who think they are winners.

If you think you're a "pro," you can be. Shed those "amie" thoughts, and you'll find that soon they will be gone, and you'll surely be a "pro."

Now that rodeo season is over, the newsletter will come out on a more irregular basis. The next issue will be the Finals issue, and will contain all you need to know about the "granddaddy of 'em all," the NRA Finals, plus Finals entry blanks, plus ballots for those NRA officers up for election. Among the terms which are up this year are those for the president and vice president. Please get your information for this newsletter in by Nov. 10. Since it appears the U.S. Postal Service has chosen to deliver the newsletter when it darn well feels like it, some of you may not receive this issue for two to three weeks after it is mailed. Please help us help you by getting your information in to the newsletter by the deadline.

# BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

AUGUST 13, 1986, 1:00 P.M. – BILLINGS SHERATON, BILLINGS, MONTANA

President Glen Hough called the meeting to order.

Roll was called and a quorum verified. Those members present included: Glen Hough, Butch Bratsky, Jann Johnson, Lois Hill, Ed Miller, Bruce Martin, Cinde Barthelme, Mark Cain, Skeeter Nordahl, Betty Benson, Bob Glasgow, Dr. Howard Holloway, Danny Halvorson, Janet Endecott, Bob Gravely, Rodger Nordahl, Bill Lynn, Bill Davis. Those events not represented: Saddle Bronc Riding, Ladies Barrel Racing.

Minutes of the April 6, 1986 Board of Directors meeting were distributed and approved as written.

The NRA finances were discussed.

Bareback Director Joe Smith has resigned from his Board position. Bill Davis moved Bruce Martin be approved by the Board as the Bareback Director through the end of the term. Rodger Nordahl seconded. Passed. Unanimous.

Butch Bratsky updated the Board on the status of the 1986 Awards Program. All saddles, buckles, and watchbands for 1986 have been received and paid for. Cost of the above mentioned awards totaling \$16,272.63. Discussion regarding the purchase of the plaques to display the buckles, watchbands and presentation photo that are given to the sponsor followed. Butch Bratsky moved: The NRA order the display plaques for the 1986 awards. Bill Lynn, seconded. Passed. Unanimous.

The office has attempted to reach Helme Tobacco regarding their presentation at the February Board meeting on becoming NRA sponsors. We have been unable to reach their representative.

The timed event jackpot during the NRA Finals was discussed. Tabled until the Fall meeting.

Box pads have not been used this summer by the contractors. The contestants would still like to see each contractor have and use box pads. Method of purchasing and further discussion tabled until Fall meeting.

Lois Hill updated the Board on the North American Rodeo Commission and the World Finals Rodeo. The WFR will be held Nov. 2-8. Contestant check-in will be on Nov. 2 at noon. The total payoff for the WFR this year will be \$140,000. Republic Tobacco and Tony Lama have been added as sponsors to this year's WFR. Entry fees will be \$200, with \$150 contested at, and \$50 as administration fee.

No further old business.

## NEW BUSINESS

Rope scorelines were discussed. Bill Lynn moved: A rope scoreline will be used at all NRA approved rodeos. Bill Davis, seconded. Passed. Unanimous.

The timed event score was discussed. Bill Davis moved: to be added to the rulebook, page 45, rule 11: Scoreline will be set according to arena and box length and conditions, but suggested guidelines are as follows: When conditions warrant the score should be no longer than: steer wrestling, length of box minus six feet; calf roping, length of box, minus four feet; team roping, length of box, minus two feet; Ladies Breakaway Roping will be governed by type of cattle roped. Mark Cain seconded. Passed. Unanimous.

Neck rope foul ruling was discussed. Bill Lynn moved: Add to rule 18, page 29: Only neck rope may cause foul. Contestant must declare him or herself by pulling up before contesting on animal. Any penalties incurred **before** foul will be assessed (i.e. broken barrier). If broken barrier is assessed, animal will be given back plus a 10 second penalty. (Judge needs to be aware of the difference of foul at and malfunction of the barrier)

The "runs on cattle ruling" is as follows: Except for split performances (where one run ends and another starts) all cattle must be run once before any are run a second time; second



run of cattle must be completed before any are run a third time, etc. If only one animal remains to complete a run on the cattle, the next person scheduled for competition will automatically be paired with that animal even though it appears to be an issued animal.

Ladies Breakaway Roping at Finals: clarification is needed whether they wish to carry one or two loops due to times taken on foul catches of breakaway calf. Discussion. Decided that the situation was handled correctly at 1985 Finals and ruling will remain the same.

Ladies Breakaway Roping: Type of string to be used and who should supply the contestants with the particular string was discussed. Butch Bratsky moved: Page 54, Rule 6 be changed to read as follows: rope to be tied with saddle with string furnished by the contestant. Cinde Barthelme seconded. Passed.

Charges to the contestants in addition to their entry fees, central entry charge, stock charge, and judge's (office) charge were discussed. Bill Davis moved: add to Rule 3, Page 8: These are the only charges that can be made to a contestant. Bill Lynn seconded. Passed

Judges' wages were discussed. Should be decided between judge and person who hired them. Judges are only approved AFTER they have purchased a current membership card.

Discussion regarding the team roping turn-out rule. Bill Lynn moved: Add to Rule (page 48, rule 18, and Page 22, Rule 15) which reads, "If a team roper's partner doesn't show up at the rodeo, he may obtain a partner from the membership of the Association, provided that person isn't already partnered in the team roping." The man who did not show up to compete is fined \$20, only, if someone else ropes in his place and his fees were paid. Cinde Barthelme seconded. Passed.

Rule 19, page 48 was inadvertently skipped in the current rule book. Team roping rule: shotgunning rule has been skipped from current rulebook and will be replaced in future rule book printings.

Discussion regarding slack following a performance as a preference when entering a rodeo. Bill Davis moved: Slack immediately following a performance can not be used as preference when entering a rodeo. Bill Lynn, seconded. Passed.

It was brought to the Board of Directors attention that the electric eye belonging to the NRA through the merger with the MRA, has not been available for use this rodeo season. Alternatives were looked into in regaining the Western NRA eye. The NRA lawyer will be contacted.

Rocky Mountain Association of Fairs Convention: Cinde Barthelme moved: The NRA send a representative to the RMAF Convention. Bob Gravely seconded. Passed.

NARC Convention. Both Lois Hill and Ed Waldhauser are members of the NARC board. Cinde Barthelme moved if the NRA needs representation, a representative will be able to attend. Lois Hill seconded. Passed.

Committee Convention: A Survey will be sent to the committees to see if they are interested.

Contestant fines: Bill Davis felt that the fines paid by the contestants involved in the turn outs at the Winnett rodeo be assessed \$20 per man, not \$20 per event. Ed Miller moved fines paid will stay as paid. Bill Lynn seconded. Passed unanimously.

Competing out of order drawn at a rodeo: Discussion. Ed Miller moved: Any contractor, judge, or contestant that competes or allows someone to compete outside the entry and draw of Central Entry will be fined \$100 and denied the right to participate in the NRA Finals. **Any member** may lodge a complaint to a director or the board if he/she witnesses an infraction of the Central Entry list. All final decisions will be made by the board. Postponed definitely. Bob Gravely, seconded. Passed.

Meeting adjourned.

# NARC NOTES

Entries for the 1986 World Finals Rodeo:

There have been some changes in the entry format for the 1986 World Finals Rodeo, changes that were necessary in order to produce the class of rodeo we are all looking forward to. The schedule we will follow in taking entries for the World Finals Rodeo is:

October 3 — Entries open. Association secretaries will call in the entries of the top 3 in each of the 7 standard rodeo events, plus all entries in the Ladies Breakaway Roping and the Old Timers Team Roping. Positions for all contestants will be drawn while you are on the phone.

Entry phone: 505-526-6272, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. (we will not take entries on Sunday, Oct. 5.)

October 10 — Entries close. No late entries will be accepted.

October 16 — Deadline for entry fees to be in. All entry fees should be wired to: North American Rodeo Commission, First National Bank of Dona Ana County, Las Cruces, N.M. All entries are final. No entry fees will be refunded without a medical doctor's release.

There will be no exceptions to these deadlines. For those associations whose finals are scheduled to be held after the entry deadline, we suggest that you set a cut-off date at least one week prior to Oct. 3 for contestants to qualify to compete at the World Finals Rodeo. I believe this manner of handling entries will also greatly reduce the amount of work the association secretaries have to put in handling their members' entries.

Entry fees are \$200 in bareback riding, saddle bronc riding, bull riding, calf roping, steer wrestling, ladies barrel race, and \$200 per man in the team roping. Of the \$200 entry fees, \$150 will be put into the jackpot and \$50 will be retained by the NARC. There will be a total of \$50,000 added money which will be split equally among the seven events. Circle Y trophy saddles and Skyline buckles will be awarded.

## Ladies Breakaway Roping and Old Timers Team Roping

The entries for these two events will be handled through the association secretaries and will be called in at the same time as the WFR entries. Entry fees will be sent in with the entry fees for the WFR. There is no limit to the number of entries from each association for either event, except that the OTTR is enter 3



times. The ropings will be jackpots and will be held at the Campbell arena in the El Paso area. Each roping will be one full go-round and two short goes. The top 6 after the second go-round will come back and rope their third head during a rodeo performance. A Circle Y trophy saddle will be awarded average winners. Entry fees are: ladies breakaway, \$100; old timers team roping, \$50 per man, enter 3 times with different partners. Old Timers Team Roping has an age limit of 90 years total minimum for the team, with each roper being a minimum of 40 years old. National Old Timers Team Roping Association rules will apply.

## Insurance

We have the opportunity to secure medical and accidental death insurance for all contestants of the World Finals Rodeo. This insurance will cost each contestant three (3) dollars and in order to get the coverage it is mandatory that all contestants buy in.

Add \$3 to each person's entry fees. Note: this is not \$3 per event but \$3 per person. This money is to be paid at the same time as the entry fees. Should premiums increase prior to the entry date to make coverage unfeasible you will be notified.

## Minor Contestants

You will receive release forms for contestants which qualify for the World Finals Rodeo that are under the age of 18 years. These release forms must be signed by the contestant's parents or legal guardians, notarized and returned to the NARC office before the contestant will be allowed to compete. Minors will not be allowed to compete under any circumstances until this requirement is on file in the NARC office.

## Stalls

Stalls for contestants' horses will be available for \$20 per horse for 1 night or 10 nights. All horses will be registered and be issued a leg band which must remain in place for the duration of the rodeo.

## Hotel Reservations

The headquarters hotel will be the Holiday Inn Sunland Park located on the west side of El Paso. The hotel is a short 15 minutes from the coliseum. The Holiday Inn is offering a special rate of \$42 per night for 1-4 persons per room



and will include:

Complimentary cocktail upon arrival for each guest.

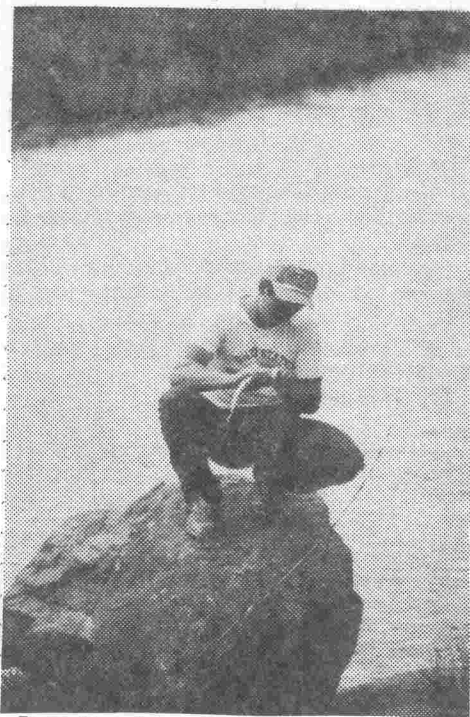

# NRA Cowboys Fatten Wallets at Lethbridge

Greg and Judy Kessler spent the winter wondering how to put some excitement in Lethbridge. Actually, they were trying to save their rodeo.

After years of providing stock for the "Whoop Up Days" rodeo in the southern Alberta city, they could see the writing on the wall.

"Greg wanted to create more interest in Lethbridge," Judy said. "This is a hard place to draw a crowd."

What the Kesslers came up with was the "Rodeo of Rodeos '86," or what could be explained as an invitational tournament. They extended invitations to eight regional rodeo associations to send the top eight in each event to Lethbridge. The invites went out to seven Canadian associations and the Northern Rodeo Association of Montana. The period used to determine eligibility was from July 4, 1985 through July 2, 1986.

"The rodeo used to be for the Chinook Rodeo Association, and it wasn't the calibre we felt Lethbridge deserved," Mrs. Kessler said. "We asked the NRA because that's the association we know real well. Those are cowboys we deal with personally. But the sponsors were all Canadians, and we wanted to keep it Canadian to a degree."

The plan was to have 64 in each event, divided over five performances. The top 10 individual scores would advance to the semifinals or short go-round, and the top five from that would go to the finals with the winner taking all — to the tune of \$5,000.

The first go-round and short go-round each paid good money. In fact, total prize money was around \$160,000, with \$75,000 for the first go and \$50,000 for the second.

NRA cowboys came home with very fat wallets, led by calf roper Mike Barthelme. The Lincoln outfitter, formerly of Miles City, was second in the first go, winning \$2,192.40, won the short go and \$2,227.20, and the \$5,000 championship. Just for good measure, his wife Cinde picked up over \$900 in barrel racing.

Scott Tomlin, a bareback rider from Roundup, won his event and pocketed over \$2,200 on his first two rides. Bull rider Kelly Wright, from Cody, Wyo., was a winner and added \$2,900. And Brock Holbrook, a Fort Shaw saddle bronc rider fresh off of picking up a paycheck at Cheyenne Frontier Days, captured his event plus over \$2,800 more.

Mrs. Kessler admitted that worrying made for a long summer for her family.

"Before the rodeo it was pretty negative. Very negative," she said Tuesday. "But just today they called us and told us anything to do with the rodeo increased by 37 percent. We feel pretty good about it, but if you don't think we were worried, you're crazy."

Now, it's full speed ahead. A few minor changes are planned for the general improvement for the rodeo, but already the five major sponsors are committed for another year and plans are to add two more and double the ante.

In the never-ending battle for the entertainment dollar, the Kesslers' imagination and courage is commendable.

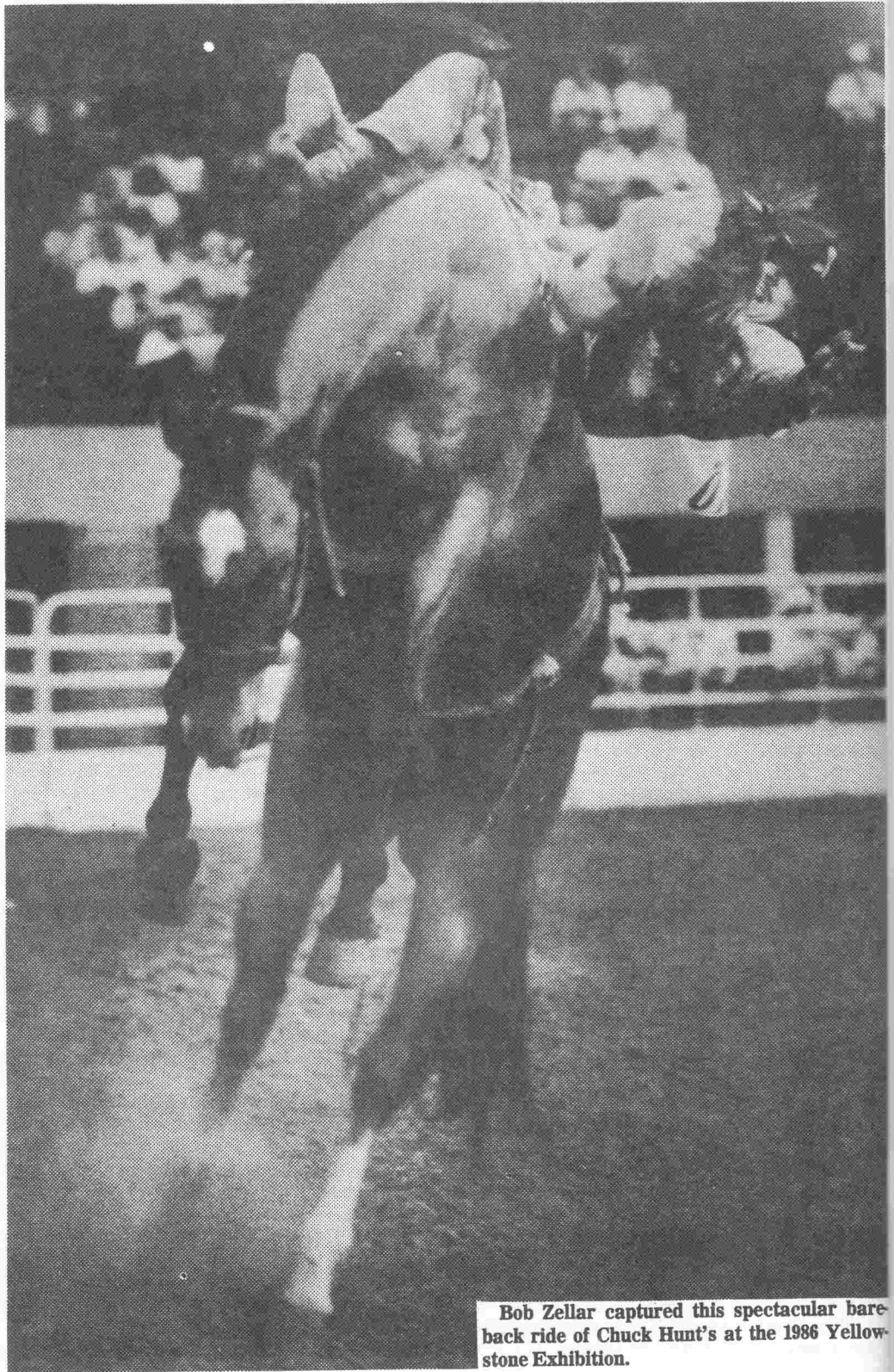

Champions crowned in each event were: Scott Schall, Arlee, bareback riding; Dan Cross, Powell, Wyo., calf roping; Tom Ferris, Dillon; saddle bronc riding, Bill Theriault, Harlowton; barrel racing, Bunny Bail, Camp Crook, S.D.; team roping, Phil Fleming and Enoch Schaffer, Ismay; breakaway roping, Janie Carlson, Two Dot; bull riding, Mike Lenning, Billings and Scott Breeding, Cody, Wyo.

Highlights of the entertainment at the rodeo were the antics of clown Steve Tomac, ably assisted by bull fighter Loyd Ketchum, and the dual announcing role played by Stan Rasmussen and his son, Will, who kept the audience and the cowboys on their toes.

## Few Are Left of Givens' Old Partners

Dode Givens is back on the rodeo trail and he's making it pay, but along the way he hasn't seen too many of his old traveling partners.

"There's a few of them here but not a heck of a lot of them," the Arapahoe, Wyo. bronc rider said Thursday afternoon as he celebrated his 33rd birthday at the Metra.

"There's not too many young guys coming up. When I first started there seemed to be more of them getting started. Maybe it gets back to economics. A person can make a lot of money, but a person has to spend a lot to get around."

Givens has been making the money. He leads the Northern Rodeo Association bronc riding standings with over \$1,800 entering the Yellowstone Exhibition rodeo. Thursday afternoon he picked up \$196.42 in day or performance money for his top score of 76 aboard T-Bone. The four-performance, one-go-round NRA rodeo will also pay the top six or eight hands in each event after Friday night's conclusion and Givens could easily get another check. Friday's performances are at 2 and 8 p.m.

One of the young cowboys Givens keeps running into is Brock Holbrook, a 22-year-old bronc rider who is also making quite a mark. The Fort Shaw hand is fourth in the NRA standings, less than \$700 behind Givens. Holbrook didn't get a chance to close any ground

on Givens at this rodeo because Thursday night Calamity Jane didn't start bucking until after the judges started scoring as Holbrook only received a 72.

Both cowboys also crossed paths in Cheyenne, Wyo., when they both placed in the Frontier Days rookie bronc riding. That proved to be just a continuation of a good year for both of them.

Holbrook started hot in college and almost came away from the College National Finals Rodeo in June with the national championship for Montana State.

"I started riding pretty good last year in college and it just got better as this year went on," Holbrook said. "And I've been lucky, drawing good. That's a big part of it.

"I'm just getting back into the NRA. I was going to a lot of other rodeos and I got bumped out of the standings. I started coming back. I want to win the NRA Finals."

Givens said, "I didn't think I'd be in this position. I went to Buffalo (the NRA-opening rodeo in Wyoming) and got on a good horse. It gave me a boost in confidence that helped me a lot."

Givens was leading the NRA standings about five years ago when he broke his leg.

"Then I went broke and so I went back to work," he said. "Then I was getting back when I broke my leg again."

At that point, he went to work in the oil field, where he stayed, getting on a just a few

horses a year, until he got laid off and started rodeoing again.

"I've been going to exercise class. It wasn't as hard as I thought it would be (to come back). I never really quit, I was never completely away and I don't think I ever will be."

Givens has won money at Cheyenne several times over the years as he bought Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association permits but he never won enough to fill the permit and get his PRCA card, "the reason being I like to stay close to home."

Holbrook, after his "surprising" collegiate season, plans to go back to MSU for his final year of eligibility and take another run at the championship. However, he plans to go to Australia this fall and rodeo with a friend.

The way things are going, Holbrook should be a winner in Australia, before he comes home to battle Givens at the NRA Finals in Metra next February.

## Breeding Rides 8 To 82

Scott Breeding demonstrated why he is leading the Northern Rodeo Association bull riding standings when he scored an 82 on Eight is Enough to highlight the opening performance of the Yellowstone Exhibition rodeo at Metra Thursday afternoon.

Eight is Enough, owned by the Small Rodeo Company of Pompey's Pillar, holds the Metra record after being ridden to a 90 at the 1982 NRA Finals early in 1983.

Breeding, the 1983 champion, was tied by Billings cowboy Mike Lenning, who had his 82 aboard Deacon Thursday night.

Another outstanding effort was turned in by team ropers Phil Fleming and Enoch Scheffer, of Ismay. Their 5.63 is the second fastest ever at the YE Fair and the seventh fastest time ever at Metra.

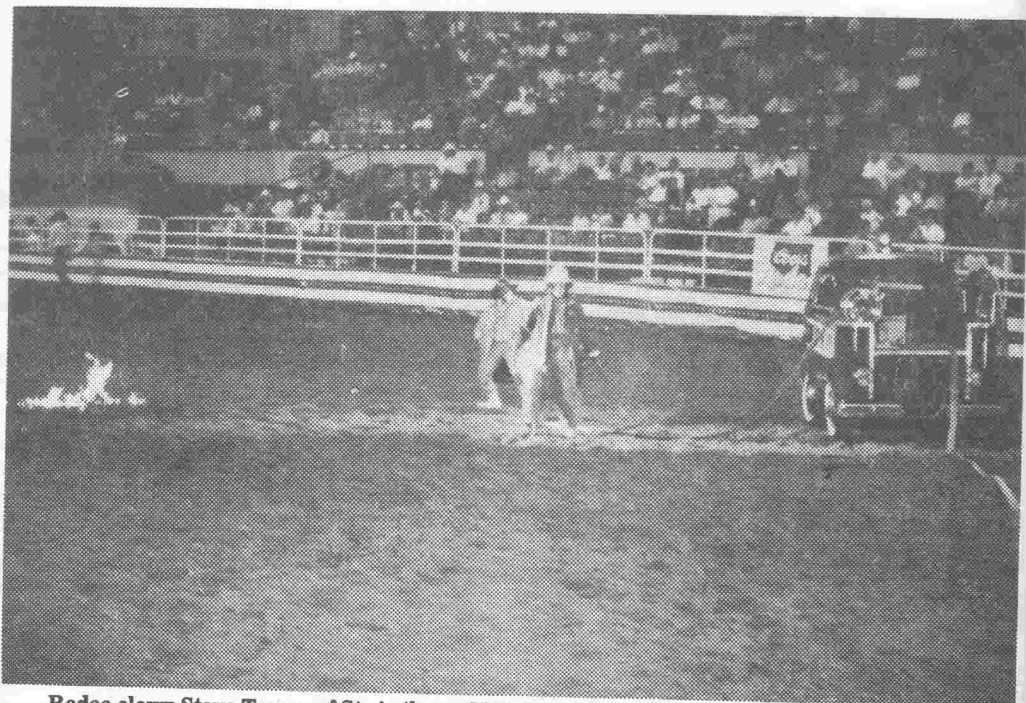
## New Rodeo Newspaper Due

If you are a member of the Northern Rodeo Association, you will begin receiving this publication, but if you are a subscriber, you may want to send in the requester form published in this newsletter.

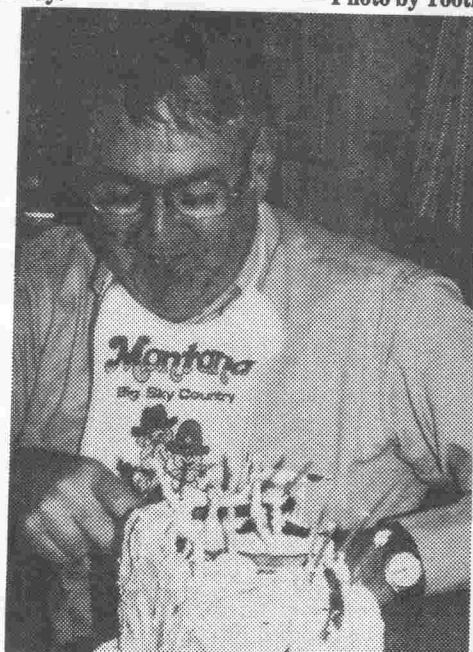

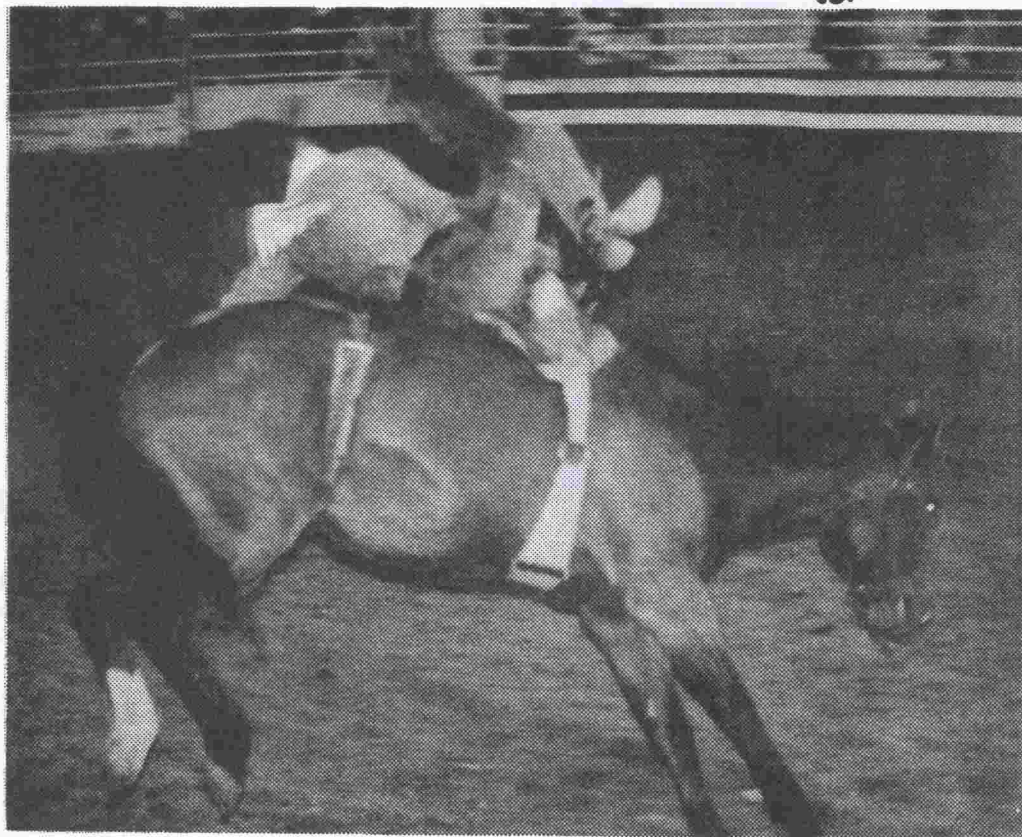

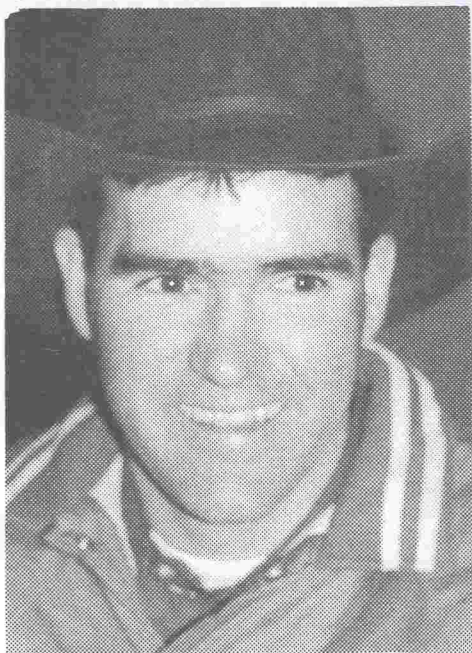

They returned home to find smoldering ashes of what had been their house.

This tragedy came on top of some other disasters facing the family, including having 40 head of heifers wash down the Yellowstone during an ice jam last February. This flood also ripped out part of their roping arena which was the site of the World Championship Ladies Breakaway Roping for several years.

Mainey has made five trips to the United States to compete in rodeos. He has been to the Calgary Stampede twice.

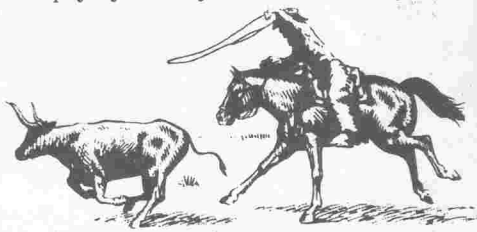
He said he likes rodeoing in the United States because there are "more rodeos and more money to be won."

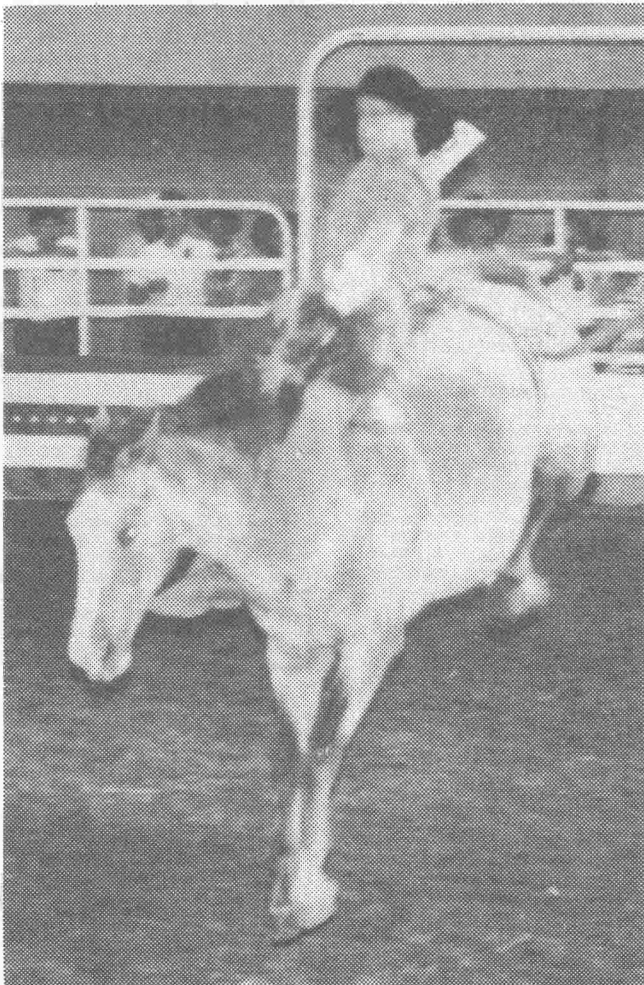
