

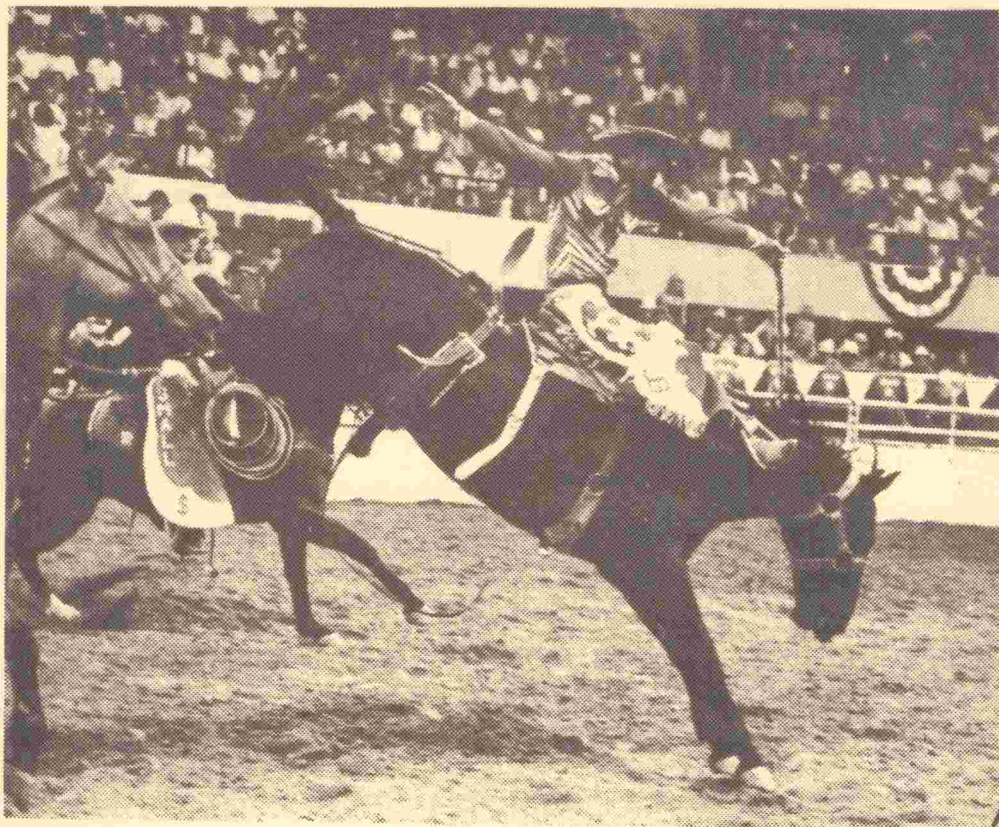

It has been a great year for everyone involved with the NRA, be it committees, donors, spectators, stock contractors and the contestants — not to mention the Northern Rodeo Association. Many of our members were competing for other associations (as they have more than one rodeo association membership card) and some were "free agents" as they and other contestants filled in spots some associations were unable to fill. But the only points that counted for our championship association award were those that were listed on our original list of contestants. These points were only counted during the first and second go-rounds, as we figured that would be the fairest, as some associations would not be going to the short go. Congratulations to ALL contestants at the North American Finals for partaking in such a great finals.

Linda Madsen is to be congratulated on winning the Montana Barrel Racers Association championship horse trailer and buckle. The close race between Judy Myllymaki and Jimi Lou Woodard for second and third place was exciting, with Judy edging out Jimi Lou at the finals by a small margin.

I am meeting with the Coors distributors of Montana, and Don Garland, the Montana representative, in Bozeman on Sept. 20. We will be evaluating the Coors program and planning for 1980.

The executive board of the North American Rodeo Commission is meeting in Great Falls on Oct. 13 and 14. We will be going over the 1979 finals and working on next year. The Lions Club from Gallup is sending a representation and so is the Adolph Coors Co.

There will be a directors meeting on Oct. 7 in the Custer Room of Holiday Inn West, Billings, beginning at 1 P.M. Although only the directors can vote, ANYONE is welcome to attend to with complaints, suggestions, ideas on rodeos, or any other kind of input. Contact me if you plan to attend.

The Rocky Mountain Association of Fairs will hold its annual meeting on November 8, 9 and 10 at the North Shore Motel in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Just a reminder for those of you who plan to attend.

North American Finals Termed Success

The first annual North American Finals sanctioned by the NAFRC held in Gallup, N.M. on Aug. 22-26 was a great success. The host committee, the Gallup Lions Club, was very gracious and had everything in order and ran their part of the finals very smoothly. Adolph Coors Co. had several representatives there and they were very pleased with the finals. The crowds were estimated at 30,000 enthusiastic fans.

The rodeo arena was very well planned for a smooth running rodeo. It is pleasant for spectator and contestant alike. The setting is exceptionally beautiful with the flags of every association plus the U.S. and Canadian flags flying on the Red Rock Hills at the end of the arena. There were only 24 associations competing, as for some reason the Manitoba Rodeo Association decided not to send any contestants. Therefore, to have a full slate of 75 contestants in each event, each association was allowed to help fill any slots with their members.

Naturally there are a few things that will be changed for the 1980 finals in Gallup, but as with anything, the first year is always the most difficult to get organized, and we have many new ideas for next year. If anyone has any thoughts that could help the next NAF please let me know before the Oct. 13 meeting of the NAFRC.

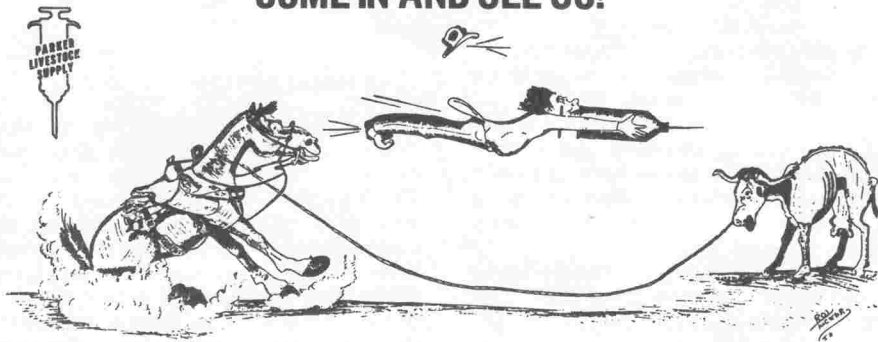

Sherri Zupan Turns Down Raquel Welch Job

A local woman who, with four other Montana girls, was selected from more than 300 hopefuls to double for screen siren Raquel Welch, says that, after considering everything, she'd rather ride the range.

Sherri Zupan, who has worked as a model, cowpoke, ski lodge assistant and carpenter's helper, was originally picked to double for Raquel Welch in a swimming episode for the movie Ms. Welch is making in Montana called "The Legend of Walks Far Woman."

Four other women were also picked to serve as photo doubles and acting doubles for sequences in the film. The action parts involved riding as well as a swimming episode.

Sherri, who was hired for the swimming part, would have had to rescue an Indian brave from the Big Horn River. But Sherri has turned down what many women would give their eye teeth for, after considering several factors.

"I guess in a way I would have rather had the riding part," Sherri said. A familiar figure and winner at rodeos around the state, Sherri noted she felt she could have done the swimming scene, but would not have had the same confidence as she would have in the riding scenes.

"I have my senior lifeguard certificate, but it just wasn't worth it for me to take that part."

Part of the reason, the candid young lady observed, was that it just wasn't worth the salary.

"It was about \$30 a day for maybe three days work," Sherri said. The riding scene part paid \$55 per day and may have involved more days.

"When I really thought about it," Sherri said, "it just wouldn't have been worth my time. I'd rather keep my job (riding and roping for her uncle, W.J. Thompson) than take three days for work on a movie set.

That may come as a disappointment for many Carbon County and Stillwater County movie goers who have enjoyed seeing people they know (or themselves) in movies made in Montana recently — particularly when she's one of the loveliest local lasses.

But, as one oldtimer noted when he heard Sherri had turned down the part, "That's fine with me. I'd rather see her in person." Amen!

Calgary Stampede - Team Rodeo Style

The 1979 Calgary Stampede is now history and even though our Montana Team didn't advance after first round competition, they certainly made a close race of it. The team that defeated them, the Badlands Team, went on to win the U.S. Championship and then the World Cup.

The Stampede this year went to a team type concept with 11 teams from Canada, Australia and the United States playing in the single elimination tournament. Five teams from Canada and Australia made up the Commonwealth Division while six teams from the States made up the United States Division.

Alberta and British Columbia battled it out for the Commonwealth Crown with British Columbia coming out the victors. The United States Championship was a closely contested match from start to finish, but the strength of the Badlands Team proved too much for the Northwest Team. This game was called by many the best match of the Stampede.

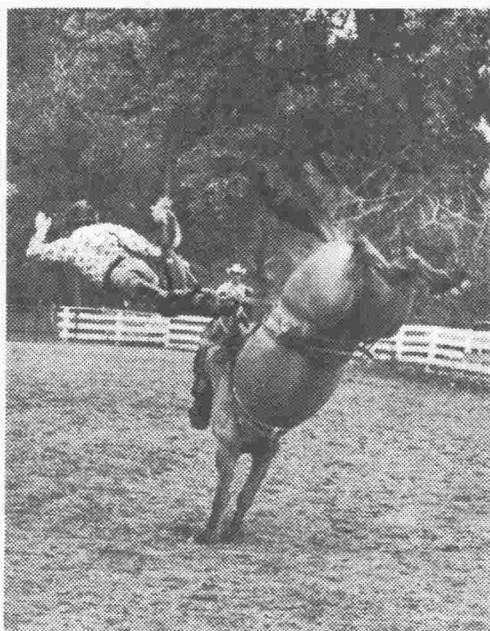
The two division champions advanced to the final round where the World Cup was up for grabs. The Badlands Team again pulled off a decisive victory and walked away as the first World Cup Champions.

Attention — Breakaway Ropers

Cinde Barthelmess, Breakaway Roping Director, has some words of wisdom for all ladies breakaway ropers which she hope will make the event better.

1. When using colored ropes, tie on a contrasting flag so it can be seen more readily.

2. Kids are not required to use regulation string.

3. When roping horned cattle, team roping rules apply, which means the roper must be mounted when the rope breaks away.

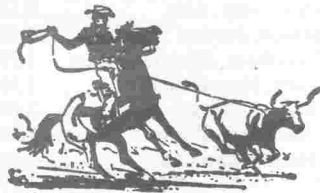
4. The rope must go over the entire head of the animal in order for the catch to be considered legal.

Gripping and complaining will not be tolerated. Girls, we are only roping because the committees and everyone wants us to. Gripping and complaining about cattle, etc., will get us nowhere except out of rodeo. In the future, fines will be assessed for this type of behavior.
