



### From the Crow's Nest



Dear NRA members;

Whew!

Another rodeo season is behind us. Time to look ahead, correct past mistakes, and plan for the future.

Each rodeo season brings its particular problems, and it seems that NRA officers always seem to come up with just the right solution to solve them ... for that year, anyway.

One thing that has bothered me this year is something that shall now be termed as **COWBOY ETIQUETTE**.

Now don't get this confused with those sometimes ubuiquitous rules set down by Amy Vanderbilt and those other old hens that have nothing better to do than sit in their Boston offices and tell us Montanans how we should behave

This relates to good old Western heritage, the way we were all brought up to behave.

It is evident that a number of cowboys (and probably cowgirls, too) forget that when they are contesting at a rodeo, they are really performing for an audience. There are people in the stands that have been to a million rodeos, who know the rules, who know what time is going to place, who know when someone makes a good ride, or ties a calf fast. And there are countless numbers of others who are witnessing their first rodeo. They are observing, they think, the West, the Real West, and every movement, every happening, every action of a contestant, and it is posted in a computer brain, for them to use for comparison, or their first and most lasting impression, which they tell their friends in New Jersey or Holland or some other far flung place. When a contestant reacts to a situation in a somewhat less-than-Western way, how do you suppose the audience reacts? Think they'll pay that \$4 or \$5 and come back tomorrow, or next year?

Several different times this year, we have observed cowboys, especially in the timed events, give up halfway through a team roping run or a steer wrestling run, or a calf roping run, just because they know it'll never place, and so, they conclude, there is no sense in continuing. Of course, the folks sitting on those splintery old bleachers don't know that an 11.5 won't bring home a check in the team roping, nor will a 7.7 in the steer wrestling (you think). It is up to you, the contesting members of the NRA, to not only do your best, but to give it your best shot, no matter what you think is a placing time or score. The people in the grandstands don't know that everyone in the slack was faster; they weren't there.

It has been said before: rodeo is like a Broadway stage play, only dirtier. The contesting cowboys and cowgirls are the "actors," and it is up them them to "entertain" the folks; give 'em what they came to see; give 'em a reason to come back next year, or maybe tomorrow; give 'em a reason to tell their friends about the really good rodeo they saw.

This issue of the newsletter contains all the rodeo results from the rest of the summer, along with the final standings. The next newsletter (to come out about Dec. 1) will contain all you need to know about the NRA Finals coming up the first weekend in February at the METRA in Billings. If you have placed in the top 10 you are eligible to compete at the NRA Finals. If you have placed among the top three, you are eligible to compete at the World Finals Rodeo in El Paso. But it is up to you to notify the NRA office of your intentions. Let Jann know if you are interested in competing.

Thank you for your support this past summer. Please don't be afraid to send us your news, or advertising, or photographs, or anything else that you think might be of interest to 1200 readers. Keep in mind that this is your newsletter — use it.

Deadline for the December issue is Nov. 10.

And don't forget to keep us informed of your current address. Think of all the good stuff that you'll miss if you don't get your newsletter!

### **Board of Directors Meeting**

AUGUST 14, 1987 - BILLINGS SHERATON, BILLINGS, MONTANA

President Glen Hough called the meeting to order.

Roll was called. Those members present included: GLEN HOUGH, ED WALDHAUSER, MIKE NOBLE, NICK ECONOM, MARK CAIN, BRUCE MARTIN, JIM BUSHNELL, CINDE BARTHELMESS, DR. HOWARD HOLLOWAY, JIM GOGGINS FOR JANET ENDECOTT, BOB GRAVELEY, BILL LYNN, NANCY PETERSEN, MARIE EBLEN, ED MILLER. Stock contractors not represented.

Minutes of March 29 Board of Directors meeting were distributed and approved as written.

The finances of the Association were discussed and accepted subject to audit.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

We have received the final paperwork and payment of the 1986 NRA Finals. Our Finals settlement was up this year over the past two years.

The Labor Day Mandan Rodeo tentatively approved by the North American Rodeo Commission will NOT be approved by NARC. Status of the rodeo is now unknown.

Jim Bushnell updated the Board on the spring judging clinic held in Bozeman. Jim Jacobsen did a good job conducting the clinic, and it was well attended.

The fiscal year of the NRA will remain December 1, through November 30, due to the fact that a better time period could not be established.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

The new payoff ruling was clarified: When less than the number of contestants place in an event than the proper payoff for that event, the places paid will be in accordance with the numbers qualified. Example: 1 qualified, receives 100%; 2 qualified, 60/40; 3 qualified, 50/30/20; etc. If all contestants fail to qualify, the entry fees and added money for that event will be sent to the NRA office to be included as added money for the NRA Finals Rodeo, allowing contestants to compete back at that money.

Non-contesting membership cards were discussed. Tom Holland moved: THE NRA WILL OFFER A NON-CONTESTING MEMBERSHIP AT A COST OF \$25 TO ALL CONTRACT PERSONNEL, TIMERS, SECRETARIES, PICKUP MEN, CONTRACT ACTS, CLOWNS, AND ANNOUNCERS. ED MILLER SECONDED. PASSED.

The NRA doctor release ruling was discussed. Abuse of the system will be closely watched.

Discussion regarding the team roping event: if the heeler is over 50 years old, they will have option of tying on. Ed Miller moved that this will be included on the agenda at the annual meeting with the recommendation that we accept the suggestion. Mike Noble, seconded. PASSED.

The Ladies Barrel Race at the Winnett rodeo was discussed. The Board felt that the points should count and will be left as is.

Rule change for annual meeting: if the LBR is flagged, 100ths to be dropped from times and payoff to be made on tenths.

### **CONTESTED FINES:**

Jerome Bell and D'Matt Speakthunder: Board moved that the fees be paid, fine refunded.

Mike Not Afraid: Board moved that the fees be paid, fine refunded.

Scott Tomlin: Board moved that due to extenuating circumstances, the fine be refunded, judges notified.

### OTHER BUSINESS

It was suggested that the Ladies Breakaway Roping use neck ropes. Will be discussed at annual meeting.

Timed event directors and contestants are concerned about the numbers of cattle used at many of the rodeos. Contractors are not supplying the proper amount of cattle for the number of entries. See rule 13, page 43.

Companion passes were discussed. A survey will be sent out to the committees asking their view of the suggestion.

Meeting adjourned.

### Sid Newman Injured; Benefits Are Planned

Sid Newman flew off a saddle bronc horse at the Jordan rodeo and was seriously injured. He is hospitalized at the Billings Deaconess Medical Center where he underwent many long hours of surgery on Sept. 2.

His many friends in the NRA have begun plans to raise money for his medical expenses and for the expenses incurred by his family because of this tragic accident.

A "Sid Newman Benefit Rodeo" has been scheduled in Ingomar on Saturday, Oct. 3, sponsored by the Melstone and Ingomar rodeo clubs, and another benefit has been scheduled in Billings in conjunction with the Northern International Livestock Exposition (NILE) on Monday, Oct. 12.

In addition, an account has been set up at the Yellowsone Bank of Billings for him. Those wishing can send donations for Sid's benefit to Jann at the NRA office.

The benefit open rodeo on Oct. 3 is scheduled to begin at 12 noon at the Ingomar rodeo grounds. The entries will be taken by Jann Johnson at 252-1122 until Sept. 30. Entry fees will be \$35 in all events except the team roping, with \$10 to go to the benefit and \$25 jackpotted. In the team roping, entry fees are \$50 per team, with \$10 going to the benefit fund, and \$40 jackpotted. Entry fees for junior

barrel racing and junior breakaway roping are \$10 with \$5 jackpotted and \$5 going to benefit Sid. A \$2 charge will be made at the gate, with all of that going to the fund. If time permits, a jackpot team roping will be held after the rodeo.

Added money will include \$100 in each the bareback riding, saddle bronc riding and bull riding.

Stock for the rodeo will be furnished by Go Rodeo Co., Ed and Leta Grebe, and there will be no stock charge.

In Billings, a team roping, barrel racing, and breakaway roping jackpot will be held on Monday, Oct. 12, beginning at 6 p.m. in the METRA Arena. A benefit barbecue will precede the ropings.

Greenhorn Roping - two

head for \$16 per team, nonprogressive, enter 5 times. One partner must be a "greenhorn," that is must have won less than \$2,000 in their lifetime.

Scrambled Egg — three head for \$27 per team, progressive after one, enter 4 times. One partner must be over 40, under 16, or mixed team.


Draw Two, Pick Two — three head for \$27 per team, progressive after one, enter four times.

Kids Barrel Race — \$5 entry fees, 12 years of age and under

Open Jackpot Barrel Race
— \$16 entry fee.

Ladies Breakaway Roping — two head for \$20.



#### Insurance

We have the opportunity to secure medical and accidental death insurance for all contestants of the Coors World Finals Rodeo. This insurance will cost each contestant three (3) dollars and in order to get the coverage it is mandatory that all contestants buy in.

Add \$3.00 to each person's entry fees. Note: this is not \$3.00 per event but \$3.00 per person. This money is to be collected and forwarded to the NARC office along with entry fees.

#### **Minor Contestants**

All contestants under the age of 18 must provide the N.A.R.C. office with a release form signed by the contestant's parents or legal guardians, and notarized. Minors will not be allowed to compete under any circumstances until this requirement is on file in the N.A.R.C. office.

### Stalls

Stalls for contestants' horses will be available for \$20 per horse for one night or 10 nights. All horses will be registered and be issued a leg band which must remain in place for the duration of the rodeo. All horses kept on the coliseum grounds must have a leg band.

#### **Hotel Reservations**

#### Jackpots

As in years past, there will be a jackpot team roping, barrel race, calf roping, steer wrestling and breakaway roping held during the Finals week. This year those jackpots will be open with the number of entries unlimited.

All jackpots will be held at an indoor arena which is located approximately 15 miles south of the El Paso County Coliseum. Entries will be taken the day of the jackpot, and more information will be posted at the coliseum during Finals week.

### Health Certificate Requirements For Livestock Entering Texas

All horses entering Texas are to be accompanied by an official health certificate stating the horses are free of any infectious or contagious disease or exposure thereto.

All horses entering the state of Texas must be tested and negative to the AGID (COGGINS) test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to entry. The name of the laboratory, date, and results of such testing must be shown on the health certificate. Individual identification of the animal(s)

must also be shown on the health certificate.

Cattle must have an official heath certificate showing such animals to be free from any contagious disease.

### Crossing into Ciudad Juarez, Mexico

Citizenship documents are not required for citizens of the United States when crossing into Juarez. If you are coming to the World Finals Rodeo from countries other than the United States, or if you are a citizen of another country living in the United States. you will need proper documentation. This includes either an alien registration card or a valid passport containing a "multiple entry visa" granted by an embassy or consulate in your home country. Documentation should be checked prior to leaving your home country. Keep in mind that even local travel in the El Paso - Ciudad Juarez area involves both entry into Mexico and re-entry into the United States.

SPECIAL NOTE TO AUSTRALIAN AND CANADIAN VISITORS: If you plan to visit Mexico and then come back into the U.S., be sure that your passport states multiple entry and not single entry. This must be stipulated at the time you secure your passport.



### Rodeo of Rodeos'87

The Lethbridge, Alberta "Rodeo of Rodeos '87" proved to be a "Pay Days of Pay Days" for Northern Rodeo Association members.

The four-day invitational rodeo run in conjunction with Lethbridge Whoop Up Days, was set up in tournament fashion with last Sunday's (Aug. 2) final performance featuring the top five in every event competing for a winner-take-all \$5,000 check.

And the winners were Billings calf roper Bill Parker and the team roping duo of Glen Hough of Shepherd, the NRA president, and Jeff Gorrell of Beach, N.D.

The rodeo is the brainstorm of Greg and Judy Kessler, the stock contractors. Faced with a fading rodeo, the Kesslers put the Rodeo of Rodeos in place last year and came away with five major sponsors: Coca Cola, Fleming Motors and Mountain View Dodge, Molson Brewery, Scotia Bank and Shell Oil.

Seven Canadian regional rodeo associations and the NRA were invited to send about eight hands in each event, although there were some variations.

The competitors work their way through two go-rounds with a top 10 going to the semi-finals, or short go-round Saturday, with those rounds also worth a paycheck to the leaders.

Last year Lincoln calf roper Mike Barthelmess, Roundup bareback rider Scott Tomlin, Cody, Wyo. bull rider Kelly Wright, and Fort Shaw saddle bronc rider Brock Holbrook all picked up more than \$2,000 on their way to win the \$5,000 bonus.

The NRA payoffs weren't quite as high this year but some people managed to more than cover expenses and pay some bills.

Hough and Gorrell split their \$5,000 and got \$429 each by placing second in the average and fourth in the short go-round.

Parker got the \$5,000 and \$475 for finishing second in the first go and fourth in the short go. He also joined Spike Guardipee of Browning for \$343 for second in the first go and \$171 for third in the short go of team roping.

Team ropers fared quite well, especially in the first go. Dennis Tryan of Billings and Shawn Steinbach of Wolf Creek won the opener for \$457 each, Parker and Guar-

dipee were second, and Bob Herman of Niarada and Ty Steinbach of Wolf Creek were third for \$228. Herman and Steinbach came back to win the second go and \$343.20. Other pairs picking up team roping money were Dick Powell and Ted Hoyt of Browning, and Rick Tryan of Helena and Larry Steele of Malta.

Tomlin, who has moved to Billings, was the only big winner of a year ago to pick up a check this time around. Tomlin won almost \$500 for placing twice, including winning the third go-round. Bruce Martin of Lewistown also placed twice in bareback riding and won close to \$500.

In bronc riding, Les Best of Big Horn, Mike Noble of Columbus, Bill Theriault of Harlowton and Arne Esp of Hardin all placed, with Noble winning the short go for \$413.

Shawn Gleason of Ennis was the only steer wrestler to place and he got over \$900 for being second in the average and third in the short go-round

Other calf ropers to place were Brad Gleason of Ennis, Lyle and Laramie Baumann of Hardin and John McKenzie of Kalispell. Gleason won more than \$600, Lyle Baumann and Laramie Baumann got more than \$500 for winning the second go.

In barrel racing, Lisa Scheffer of Hamilton placed three times, including first in the second go, for almost \$600. Rayna Prewitt of Bozeman placed twice for \$100.





### **Huge Horses Show Off at Fair**

The Coors Belgians are power and grace in motion.

Harness bells jingling and black hoofs prancing, the six-horse team trotted into the Metra arena for its debut at Fairtime '87.

The Belgians wheeled off a figure eight, then repeated the maneuver making the eight about half the size, never once upsetting the restored antique wagon loaded with wooden kegs.

Demonstrating a beer delivery, the team positioned the wagon then quickly sidestepped 180 degrees to make room for another imaginary team — all without moving the wagon.

The Adolph Coors Co. revived the turn-of-the-century tradition of delivering beer by draft horses in 1982 when it contracted for two hitches.

Hitch driver Gene Hilty said his team of Belgians makes 150 to 175 appearances at fairs and parades and travels about 45,000 miles a year in two large trucks across the Western states and Canada. Coors has another Belgian hitch in the East.

The crew is home in Simla, Colo. only about 80 days a year, he said. The Belgians are owned by Jim Hilgendorf.

To be on the Coors team, a Belgian must meet certain requirements, Hilty said.

The horses, all geldings, must be red sorrel in color; have light manes, tails and legs, and have a white stripe down their faces. Hilty said they also must stand at least 17 hands 3 inches tall.

At maturity, each Coors Belgian stands at least 18 hands and weighs more than 2,000 pounds, making the hitch one of the largest in the world. Chris, the biggest on the team, stands 18 hands, 3 inches, and weighs 2,350 pounds, he said.

The Belgians were originally imported from Belgium to upgrade the American draft horse. Today, Belgians are the most popular and plentiful of the four draft breeds and have gentle natures and giant appetites.

The horses eat three to five gallons of special grain mixture plus 30 to 50 pounds of hay per day and drink 15 to 20 gallons of water per day.

Each horse is individually controlled by the drivers from atop the bright red wagon. Built in the 1890's, the oak wagon was used by Meadowbrook Farms until 10 years ago when Coors bought it. Now restored, the wagon is worthy about \$40,000, Hilty said.

The leather harnesses are worth about \$30,000, and each Belgian costs between \$5,000 and \$12,000. The whole hitch is about a \$250,000 investment.

Horses aren't the only animals on the team.

Bo, a Dalmatian, is the mascot and rides on the seat next to the drivers. She, too, pulls her weight by helping to exercise the Belgians.

Hilty said that, when a corral is available, he'll turn Bo and a Belgian loose and let them play.

### Carpenter, Melaney Big Winners at Billings

Richard Carpenter of Kalispell and Mary Melaney of Wolf Creek were the big winners at the Metra Park Fairtime '87 Northern Rodeo Association rodeo.

Carpenter picked up \$2,331.86 by winning the calf roping with his time of 10 seconds, and paired with Dennis Tryan of Billings to finish in a tie for second in team roping, worth \$979.92. The pair tied with Sid and Robert Newman of Melstone at 6.1, with Cavin and Jay Murnion of Jordan winning the event with a 5.5, earning \$1,358 each.

Melaney finished second in breakaway roping, tied for sixth in barrel racing and tied for fourth, with partner Mark Salmond of Choteau, in team roping to earn \$1,714.72.

The breakway roping winner was Nancy Petersen of Three Forks who earned \$1,338.60 for her time of 2.5. Melaney was a 2.8 and won \$1,070.88. She picked up \$154.96 in barrel racing and \$488.88 in team roping.

Winning the barrel racing was Tori Woodard of Miles City with a 13.82, which was worth \$1,033.05.

The other big winner was Bob Schall of Arlee, who placed in bareback riding, steer wrestling and team roping for a total of \$1,250.60.

Bareback riding was the only two go-around event. Schall won the first go with a 77 on Deer Lodge. Lane Yeager of Choteau took second with a 77 on War Paint and won the average with a 151 total. All firsts were worth \$333.03. Schall tied for third in the second go and won \$124.89, and placed second in the average, one point back, for another \$249.72.

Rooster Reynolds of Twin

Bridges and Mike Barrett of Dillon tied for first in steer wrestling at 4.7 seconds and won \$1,282.22. Schall was sixth at 5.6 and won \$341.93. In team roping, paired with Dean Wang of Missoula, Schall was sixth at 7.3 seconds and won \$325.92.

In bull riding, Scott Breding of Cody, Wyo., won \$1,142.18 for his 76-point ride on Little Mission. Bronc riders Casey Fredericks of Choteau and Kirk Marchant of Lovell, Wyo. tied for first at 77 and won \$870.82 each. Fredericks rode Calvert High and Marchant rode Mr. Jones.

There were nearly 400 entries in the rodeo with a payout of about \$37,000.



### A Rodeo Weekend

These are the times in a western Montana summer you don't appreciate until a cold night in January.

Say you're in Polson. A soft, warm July evening. With the proper equipment — maybe a water ski and a pair of cowboy boots — you could indulge in two summer delights at very nearly the same time and place.

Water and rodeo.

The Polson rodeo grounds
— where the annual KERR
Country Rodeo detonated
again last weekend — overlooks the Flathead River near
its outlet at Flathead Lake.

During the Saturday evening performance, while skiers whip by on the river behind souped-up outboards, a sunfishing saddle bronc unseats his rider in a dust cloud of violence.

The next day, you could be in Drummond. The Sunday forenoon is hot. A sniff of new-cut hay wafts down from the Flint Creek Valley.

Nearly 500 foreigners from the International Choral Festival in Missoula are in town for the annual American Legion Rodeo.

Downtown, Main Street is lined by cars and people awaiting the rodeo parade at noon. Sam DiMaggio, proprietor of Drummond Foods, sells munchies to a small group of Italian musicians. He carries out the transaction with obvious relish in the visitors' native language.

"I'm Sicilian," DiMaggio explains when the customers are gone.

Across the Clark Fork River at the rodeo grounds, horse trailers, campers, stock trucks and cars are parked haphazardly in the area behind the stock pens. The morning slack runs are over, and the waiting game resumes. It's a game contestants and their families play out for hours — sometimes days — in exchange for a few seconds of action.

July is the hottest of months for rodeo. Most of the cowboys and cowgirls in Drummond follow the Montana Pro Rodeo circuit. They were in Butte, or maybe Wolf Point, the day before.

Kevin Nordahl of Helena, a 26-year-old veteran of the MPR who would win the bull riding contest in Drummond, traveled to rodeos in Livingston, Red Lodge (twice), Calgary (three times), Cody and Saskatoon between July 2 and July 12.

In Polson, the competitors' faces are generally younger. This is an NRA event, sometimes erroneously called an "amateur" rodeo. Prize money is awarded in every event.

Monte Finn, a year out of high school in Big Timber, got bucked off his bull in East Helena the night before.

His Fourth of July schedule included rodeo stops in Harlowton, Ennis and Roundup. Finn went to the National High School Finals in 1986, and has decided to go back to college, Montana State, in September.

An hour before the Polson rodeo, Finn climbs on a fence overlooking a pen of bulls, searching for No. 15 — his enemy for the night. "The best part," he admits, as he gazes over the intimidating animals, "is getting off and getting away."

No. 15 does Finn dirt this night, stumbling on his first jump out of the gate and immediately unseating the young cowboy. Finn removes himself safely from the premises.

Kids do the darnedest

things at rodeos.

Before things get rolling in Polson, 6-year-old Cole Hibbs of Cut Bank and 4-year-old Jordan Holland of Dillon help move the calves across the arena to the roping pens.

They swing red and blue rubber-looking lariats and take obvious pride in their

roles as helpers.

After the rodeo, two young girls — one with a big number 160 on her back identifying her as a junior barrel racer — take their sport to its horseless essence.

Afoot in the powdery parking lot, one scampers around two beer cans and a paper cup in the requisite cloverleaf pattern. The other silently ticks off the seconds.

It hurts to rodeo. You can't get around it.

Gravity and tension, along with animals that care nary a whit about a cowboy's wellbeing, conspire to dance on his pride, his psyche, his body.

Rarely do you get a chance to do anything about bruised and battered pride.

But Dusty Crary does on Sunday.

The Choteau cowboy, a perennial force on the prorodeo circuit's saddle-bronc scene, won that contest in Butte Friday night.

But in the main event in Drummond, Crary "fell off like an old fat lady," as he himself describes it later.

A special event — tabbed the match saddle bronc contest — keeps Crary and the rest of the bronc riders around. They ride another time for a \$450 purse. This time Crary bests his mount and wins the purse, not to mention the hearts of the overflow crowd after the whistle by nonchalantly replacing his hat atop his head.

### A Rodeo Weekend

"A little flair doesn't hurt," calls Reg Kesler of Missoula, the rodeo's producer, as Crary is scooped up by a pickup man.

The specter of injury always dances in the back of a rodeo cowboy's mind.

Dr. Keith Peterson, a University of Montana graduate and now a sports medicine physician from Seattle, makes several trips a summer to Montana pro rodeos. This weekend, for the first time, he has in tow his spanking new Mobile Sports Medicine Center — a 63-foot-long customized trailer.

Over the course of the 3½-hour rodeo in Drummond, he and his assistant, Missoula native Bill Reynolds, handle 17 injuries worthy of recording in their log.

The worst is the concussion and facial abrasions Lee Hankamp of Melrose receives when his bulldogging steer doesn't cooperate.

"Lot of ankles today," muses Peterson, as he scans his list. "Ankles and knees."

The last bull has bucked.

Usually that means the rodeo is over, but in Polson mechanical problems with the barrier disrupted the break-away roping contest earlier in the evening.

It is finished at the end of the show as the crowd saunters from the stands. More problems — matching the right steer with the right roper — delay the ending even further.

The sun has settled down over a ridge to the west when the last loop is thrown. The few remaining friends, kinfolk, officials and contestants trickle off the rodeo grounds.

To where?

Well, the Diamond Horseshoe Bar near Polson is jammed an hour later with both rodeoers and softball players from a local tournament.

Finn has long thrown his duffel bag into a dusty subcompact station wagon and headed back to Big Timber.

In Drummond, the streets are crowded with revelers soon after the rodeo. It'll be elbow-to-elbow in the town's three bars — Swede's Place, Mickey's and the Canyon Bar — for hours.

Back on the rodeo grounds, professional clown Kelly La-Coste relaxes with a beer, leaning on the side of his pick-up. LaCoste, from Medicine Hat, Alberta, spent the previous two nights working in the rain at Butte, and will clown next for a five-day rodeo in Saskatchewan.

"I'll be heading down I-90 through Billings and Miles City and stop tonight when I find a laundromat," he says.

Gary Woodard, the calf roping champ at Drummond, is also headed east. He's got a ranch south of Miles City with 300 irrigated acres. After roping in Wolf Point Friday night, he returned home to change pipes Saturday morning, then hightailed it to Butte to compete that night.

Nordahl's destination is closer. He runs a painting company in Helena and will catch up on some work there before attending a bull riding invitational in Roundup on Thursday.

Crary and bareback rider Lane Yeager get a ride to the Drummond airstrip south of town. Crary owns a four-seat Cessna he flies to rodeos. "I hate to drive," he says.

Duffel bags slung over their shoulders, Crary and Yeager trudge to the plane and climb aboard.

Presently the cowboys, the plane and another rodeo weekend disappear into the blue Montana sky.

### **Arena Dust**

Lisa Scheffer was the 1987 year-end winner in the Montana Barrel Racers Association, after the conclusion of the Finals held Labor Day weekend at White Sulphur Springs. In doing so, she set three new records in that organization: most money won in one season, over \$10,000; biggest lead over second place, and most times to have won the year end championship, three.

Enoch Schaffer lost his hat at Hamilton, but found it on top of Cleo Boyce's camper. It is still a mystery how it got up there.

Kent Nordahl was the winner of the Shawn Senecal memorial buckle awarded to the winner of the bull riding at the Tri County Fair and Rodeo at Deer Lodge. Senecal was an up and coming bull rider from Avon who was killed in a car accident last winter.

"Da boys" tried their luck at fishing in famous Spring Creek near Lewistown again this year. Joe Walters of Spring Creek Colony, their host, said, "The fish were so big, the photograph weighed 7 pounds."

Rumor has it that Steve Cutler may soon be riding a pinto horse.

Friends and relatives are invited to an open house in honor of Carrie Munson and Jim Bignell on Saturday, Sept. 26 a the Avon Community Hall beginning at 8 p.m. They were married Sept. 12 at Mackay, Idaho.

Mike Noble claims he is "retiring" from active rodeo participation.



### **ARENA DUST**

Kristy Hersrud of Columbus (or Dickinson, N.D.) was the year-end champion in the Breakaway Roping for the North Dakota Rodeo Association with total earnings of \$1,470.03. Kayleen Chaffee ended up fifth for the year. Both are NRA members and attend Dickinson State College. Kritsty went into the College National Finals in first place in the breakaway roping national standings, experienced dismal luck during the CNFR, and ended up second for the year in the NIRA.

Mary Ellen Hill has returned to her teaching duties in Scottsbluff, Neb. for another year, after spending the summer in Montana. Mike and Peggy Smith have moved from Ronan to a small place near Deer Lodge.

A number of Choteau, Cut Bank and Browning residents have played parts in the movie "War Party" which is being filmed in these areas. Many of these people are some you may know, so watch for familiar faces when the movie is released.

Late summer rodeo injuries included those of bullfighter Kevin Hill, who took a thrashing at Boulder. A broken collar bone and other assorted injuries will keep him out of the bull ring for a while, but he found something else to keep himself involved in the rodeo action. He was a timer at the Ravalli County

NRA President Glen Hough
wore a new hat at White Sulphur Springs over Labor Day,
this one with a stampede
string. Not known usually to
lose his hat, the reason for the
stampede string remained a
mystery, until it was revealed

hat was the victim of a "blown
out of the camper" incident.

Lisa Scheffer will be glad to hug that Aussie, Phil Mainey, when she lands in Sydney, Australia on Sept. 28 for a three month stay "down under." Tentative plans call for Phil to come back to the states with her the end of December.




