



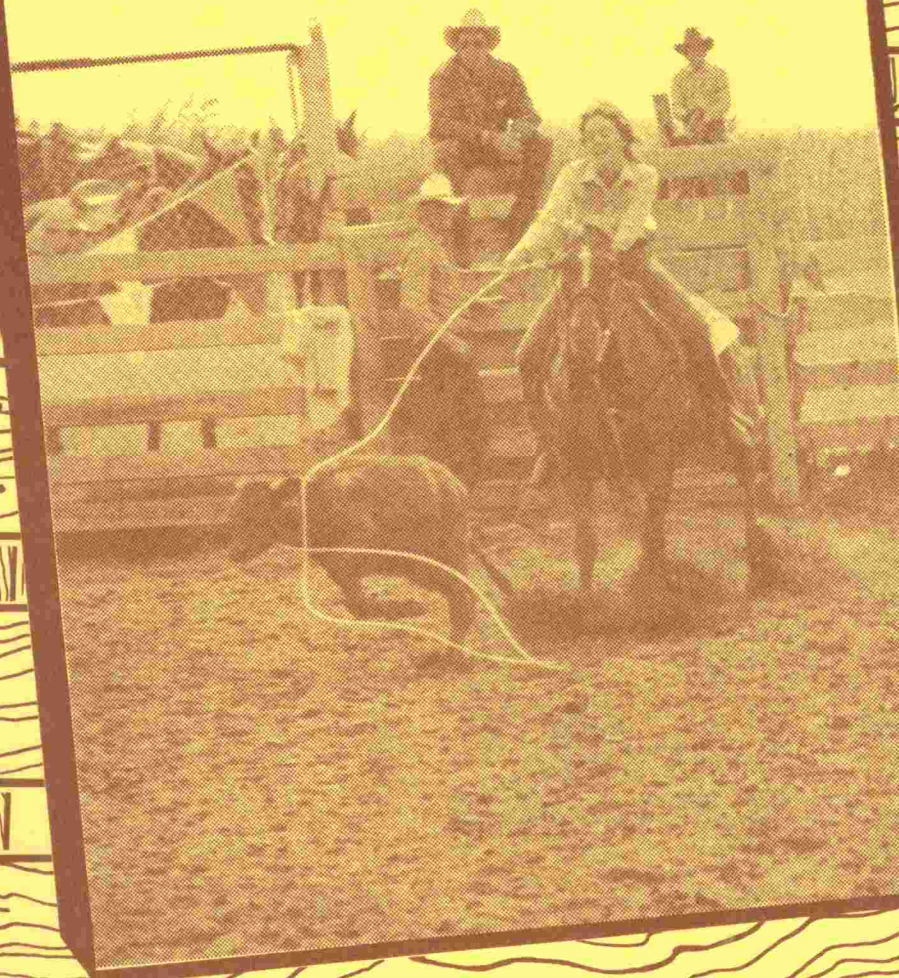

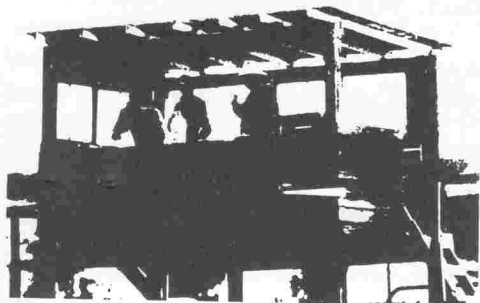

Board of Directors Meeting

August 17, 1983 – Yellowstone METRA, Billings

President Ed Waldhauser called the meeting to order.

The minutes of the April 16, 1983 meeting were read and approved. The financial report was read and approved.

Roll was called. Those members present were as follows: Ed Waldhauser, Mark Norem, Jann Johnson, Lois Hill, Don Malli, Bill Stovall, Mike Lenning, Joe Smith, Marlene Hawks, Butch Bratsky, Mike Barthelmess, Kent Mosher, Cinde Barthelmess, Debbie Burghduff, Willard Moore, Bill Davis, Jay Linderman, Eddie Grebe, Gary Wilhelm, Glen Hough, Lonnie Hankinson and Janet Endecott.

NRA/MRA membership for 1982 (954 members) and 1983 membership (1021) was looked at.

The North American Rodeo Commission and the sponsorships received from them for the NRA/MRA was discussed. Coors is our only NARC acquired sponsor.

Direction of funds from MRA suspended list fines was brought up. In 1982, all collected MRA fines were returned to the MRA. Willard Moore made the motion that the NRA continue to recognize the MRA suspended list and that all funds received from this suspended list will stay in the NRA fine account. Mark Norem seconded. Motion carried. An accounting of all MRA funds by the fall meeting will be requested.

Problems have arisen with doctor releases in the Team Roping. One partner presents a doctor release and the other is still left in the rodeo. Don Malli moved that the doctor releases in the team roping cover both partners. The partner not covered by the doctor release has the option to find a partner for that rodeo, or be covered by the other's doctor release. Mike Lenning seconded. Motion carried. The fines for Bob Riley and Bob Turnbull, both protested fines concerning doctor release problems, will be returned to them.

Lois Hill moved that Doug Smith not be assessed his turn-out fine in Hardin as he was needed as a judge in Wilsall. Bill Stovall seconded. Motion carried.

It was mentioned that someone has been drawing some of the cowboys out of various rodeos. The cowboys being drawn out are unaware that they have been drawn out. The stock contractors will be notified of the problem and asked to please try and help with the problem.

The 1983 Whitehall rodeo did not pay their judges the correct amount. Mark Norem moved that the NRA/MRA pay the Whitehall judges for their deficient funds not received for judging Whitehall. The Whitehall rodeo committee will be contacted to reimburse the NRA/MRA for the remaining payment for the judges. If payment from Whitehall is not received, the Whitehall rodeo will be placed on the suspended list. Jay Linderman seconded. Motion carried.

The anonymous letter to the NRA/MRA Board of Directors was addressed.

Problems with timers and their timing procedures at various rodeos were discussed. Page 22, Number 2, in the rulebook addresses the problem. A letter from the office will be sent out and it will be published in the newsletter.

Gary Wilhelm moved that the barrels in the barrel racing event be set on the inside edge of the pattern of the stakes, with the outside edge of the barrel on the stakes, as shown by the following diagram:



Cinde Barthelmess seconded. Motion carried.

Time of the stock draw and position draw will possibly be put on the sanction form for each particular rodeo, or given to the contestant on entry day. Tabled until fall meeting.

Precedents for turn-outs will be addressed at the fall meeting. If your fees are paid and someone takes your stock, no fine. If your fees are paid and no stock has been drawn for you, no fine.

As voted and passed at the April 16, 1983 meeting in Bozeman, an additional five (5) committee directors will be added to the NRA/MRA Board of Directors. The NRA/MRA attorney was contacted and said the Board could appoint the five (5) committee directors for the remainder of the 1983 year. Don Malli moved that the Eastern Committee Directors shall include: Bob Glasgow of Billings, Dr. Howard Holloway of Harlowton, and Danny Halvorson of Big Timber. The Western Committee Directors shall include: Janet Endecott of Ennis, Bob Gravely of Townsend, and John Carpenter of Kalispell. Willard Moore seconded. Motion carried.

The ballots have been sent out to all NRA/MRA stock contractors for the nomination of the Finals Stock. Please try and get your list of stock into the office as soon as possible so that the cowboys can vote and we can let you know. The Finals Judges will also be voted on by the cowboys.

Insurance for the Finals (weather insurance) was addressed. Tabled until the fall meeting.

Helena would like to have an NRA/MRA rodeo in addition to their PRCA rodeo. Possibly a series of rodeos in conjunction with the Kalispell series of rodeos. Jim Foley or a representative from Helena will attend the NRA/MRA fall meeting.

Some of the rodeos have been charging \$4 per man in the team roping for stock. This should be \$2 per man, not \$4. 1984 rule books will show this.

Jay Linderman spoke on his finding on entry fees vs. added money. A scale could possibly be set up and followed either in the rule book or on the sanction. Tabled until the fall meeting.

Regional buckles will be given in the Junior events in both the west and east regions. They were ordered along with the adult regional event buckles.

Meeting adjourned.

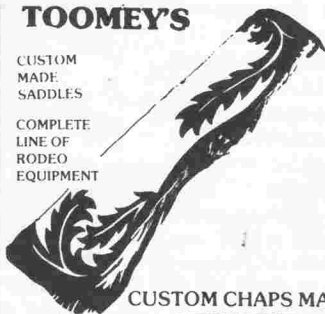

More to Rodeo for MSU Cowboy

From 'Cat Tracks' - June 1983
Montana State University

The world of rodeo involves a lot more than riding bulls and broncs or wrestling steers for Montana State University's Rodger Nordahl.



The Bobcat cowboy has combined the competitive end of the sport with the administrative end to keep him more than busy during his senior season of competition. The Helena native, a standout member of the Big Sky Region championship team, has taken on the added responsibility as the regional student director for the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA).

"There's a lot more responsibilities for a student director and that puts added pressure on the way I perform," Nordahl said. "I get to see rodeo from two sides, which has been a great learning experience for me."

Nordahl's responsibilities include representing the Big

Sky Region on the NIRA board and the handling of competitors' problems during regional rodeos.

"I've been student director for two years now and I guess I'm getting used to the added responsibilities," Nordahl noted. "One of the biggest concerns I have during rodeos is trying to keep my intensity level up during the competition and that is sometimes tough when I'm trying to hear other competitors' problems too."

Nordahl is no stranger to competitive athletics. Along with his rodeo interests, Nordahl was a standout athlete at Helena Capital High School where he was a starter on the 1978 Bruins' Class AA state championship football team. He also captained the wrestling team his senior season.

"In all sports, especially rodeo, I really enjoy being around the people and the competition," Nordahl said.

"It's a tremendous feeling when you come through with a great effort."

Last season Nordahl finished third at the CNFR in the steer wrestling and hopes on improving that mark this year. If not this year, the senior in accounting will have one more shot, as being the NIRA student director allows him an extra year of eligibility.

"Rodeo has been a great experience for my college days. Being a student in a tough curriculum, a competitor and a student director really kept me busy, but as I look back on my first four years, I wouldn't have done it any other way," he concluded.

Editor's Note: "Skeeter" is a member of the NRA/MRA and is in the top 10 of the 1983 standings in both the bull riding and the steer wrestling.

Information for Timers

As important as rodeo judging is to the success of a rodeo, so is the timing of the rodeo events. Apparently, rodeo committees and stock contractors don't feel the same way, because they worry about obtaining competent judges, and just pick up a timer when they get to the rodeo, and the discrepancy in pay for the two, judges and timers, is wide enough to get the women's libbers up in arms.

Nevertheless, when a person is hired to time a rodeo, then they should take on the responsibility to do the best job they can, concentrating on what's going on at the rodeo at all times, and most of all, following the rules in the rule book. A great deal of money rests on their accuracy.

It has come to the attention of your Board of Directors that some of the rules have not been followed this past summer.

For instance, page 4, rule 5 in the rule book, the electric eye rules in the barrel racing, states, "When the electric eye is used there will be flag times and electric eye times kept in the crow's nest, secretary's book and timers' sheets."

This means that the OFFICIAL time in the barrel racing is the electric eye time, but HAND OR FLAG TIMES MUST BE RECORDED in the event the electric eye malfunctions — and it sometimes does.

The timers' sheets contain two columns; one (the narrowest column) should be used for recording the hand times, and the other column, the wider one, for recording the official electric eye time. I use pens with two different colored inks to make it easier for the secretary, contestants, flaggers, and all interested to distinguish between the two recorded times.

The rule also states that if the electric eye fails to work 51 percent of any one performance, then flag times will be used for the entire rodeo.

This rule mandates that hand times be recorded at all times, for what happens if the eye works the first day of a rodeo and not the next?

Most of the time there is a discrepancy between the hand times and electric eye times; pure human reaction accounts for most of this, and, quite simply, some flaggers are better than others. Nevertheless, no matter what the discrepancy, the electric eye time is the official time unless the eye malfunctions.

The rodeo announcer is free to read the time from the eye himself and announce it, dropping the thousandths column of numbers. The timers record that time, then average their

hand times and record that. It takes a little longer between barrel racers to do this, but it is important, and with a little practice, a system and thence speed can be developed.

In the other events at a rodeo, the biggest factor is being accurate is paying attention, concentrating on the action and not being distracted. This means that timers should **not** expect to watch the rodeo, and any unnecessary people in the announcer's stand should be booted out. (This includes parents who think you cheat). It also is very distracting for the announcer and timers to have the rodeo secretary in the announcer's stand, and she should find a new place to take fees.

All rodeo officials, judges, timers, committee people, and all interested, should read the rules about the electric eye on page 45 and 46 of the rule book.

Upgrading of the timers at rodeos may never happen until they are accorded the same status as the other rodeo officials.

Arena Dust

Skeeter Nordahl hung his foot up on a post during the bull riding at White Sulphur Springs and dislocated his foot. Reportedly he will be sore for some time, but will be able to compete again in a few weeks.

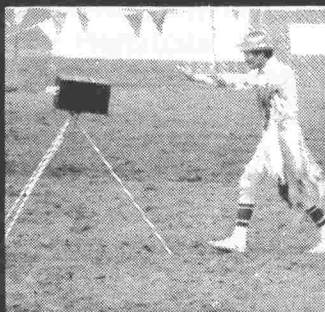
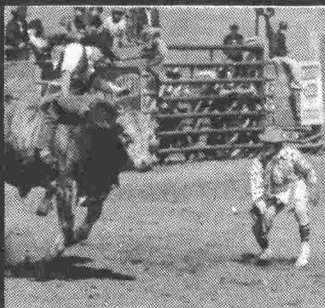

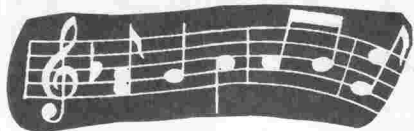

Dale Small's famous old bull, "Tequila," went to "the great bull pen in the sky" recently. He did not meet a spectacular demise and was merely sold through the ring at PAYS. He had a long and colorful career as one of the top bulls in the Small pen.

Smalls also lost a couple of horses in the arena. "Whirlygig" bucked into the back of the pick-up man's horse at Billings, breaking his neck, and a new horse, "Bear Creek," bucked head on into the fence at Red Lodge, killing him instantly. Cory Steen of the Steen Family trick and fancy riders escaped serious injury during an exhibition at the Central Montana Fair rodeo when she attempted to go under the belly of the horse as it galloped around the arena. Fortunately she was wearing a helmet.

Wedding bells will soon ring for Bill Davis and Jennifer, Kevin Nordahl and Sheryl, Kent Mosher and Donna, Tracy Mikes and Jody, and possibly others. Congratulations to all, with wishes from the News on many years of wedded bliss.

Bryan Barthelmess, son of Mike and Cinde, got a big, new, black hat as a gift from Richard Carpenter. He has since developed the appropriate gait to accompany the fedora.

Record crowds at the Central Montana Fair and Rodeo pleased the fair board and tickled rodeo stock contractor Dale Small. The excellent weather during the three-day rodeo helped make the crowds throng to the rodeo.

Barthelmess Family Thrives On the Rodeo Circuit

Cinde Barthelmess has no problem with summer boredom.

The ranking barrel racer and breakaway roper has been riding the rodeo circuit this summer with her husband, also a top rodeo cowboy, and their two-year-old son.

Since May, the Barthelmesses have been back at their Miles City ranch only two weeks.

The rest of the time the couple has either been galloping across a rodeo arena or jockeying their motor home down a lonely stretch of Montana highway. They figure by the time the rodeo season winds down in the next few weeks, they will have ridden in nearly 60 rodeos throughout Montana and Idaho.

Last weekend, for example, they hit three rodeos in two days. Immediately after competing in a rodeo in Havre Saturday they drove 338 miles to Superior for Sunday morning "slack" competition. (When more competitors enter a rodeo than can be fit into a regular performance, the overflow competes in what is called a "slack" event). By Sunday afternoon, they were in Ronan for another rodeo.

Then it was on to Billings for the Yellowstone Exhibition rodeo.

The Barthelmesses and their two horses made it to the rodeo on time, but their motor home and horse trailer didn't. The vehicle broke down near Deer Lodge and friends, "good friends," says Cinde gratefully, brought them into Billings.

Their days and nights on the road sound exhausting to a non-rodeoing civilian, but they have paid off for the couple this summer.

In Northern Rodeo Association standings, based on earnings, Mike ranked first in calf roping and fourth in all-around men's events going into the Yellowstone Exhibition rodeo. Last year, he was the 1982 NRA calf roping champion and placed second in team roping.

Cinde is first in barrel racing, ninth in breakaway roping, and leads women in all events.

The Barthelmesses have worked hard for those standings, but they seem to thrive on the gypsy way of life that makes it all possible.

Minutes after Cinde finished her first event in Billings Tuesday, she hurried off to collect young Bryan who was being looked after by friends.

Cinde scooped up the golden haired youngster in her arms and hugged him as she

continue to chat with his babysitters.

When Cinde took a seat in the empty grandstands, Bryan played quietly near by. She seemed unperturbed during a test of the Metra's sound system when a recording of the "Star Spangled Banner" blasted forth at an ear-splitting volume. Despite the long weeks traveling, there wasn't a trace of tiredness in her hazel eyes or weariness in her strong, bright voice.

Brown curls sprang in profusion from beneath her straw cowboy hat and her blue striped shirt still looked fresh.

The 29-year-old native of Arizona was born into rodeoing. Her mother, a trick roper, and her father, a calf roper, helped Cinde onto her first rodeo horse when she was 5.

"We had an old mare who kinda babysat us," remembered Cinde.

She met Mike at Montana State University where both rode for the MSU rodeo team. (An accomplished silversmith, Cinde graduated with a degree from MSU in fine arts.)

The couple continued traveling the rodeo circuit after their marriage in 1976 and after the birth of their son in 1981.

Bryan was born by Caesarean section in April and Barthelmesses and their infant son were on the road two months later.

Cinde kept nursing Bryan until he was 13 months old. That wasn't easy, she said, but

rodeo people helped out. Even young cowboys who had little experience with tiny babies volunteered to care for Bryan.

It's people like that and the wholesomeness of the rodeo world that keeps Cinde and Mike coming back summer after summer.

"Animals are matter of fact. They're down to earth — square. They won't love you one day and kiss you off the next," said Cinde.

"Rodeo people are like that, too. They're genuine, sincere. You can count on them."

Petty jealousies that can curdle the enjoyment of competing in some sports is largely missing in rodeoing.

Cinde's conversation was interrupted several times by cowboys and cowgirls asking about her horse, Speedy Trip, which had stone bruised its foot before the breakaway roping event Tuesday.

"You see?" Cinde said, after Dallas Currey of Jordan, a cowboy who competes against Mike, wished her horse well. "That's what I'm talking about."

Bryan has lately taken an interest in horses.

"And boy are we glad," said Cinde with a wide grin. She quickly added that she's going to try her best not to push the child and let him go at his own pace.

Meanwhile, the Barthelmesses plan to go on rodeoing "as long as we still enjoy it and can keep paying the bills."

If there ever comes a time they have to stop, there'll be something very special missing from their lives.

That's because, said Cinde, the rodeo "is life at its best."

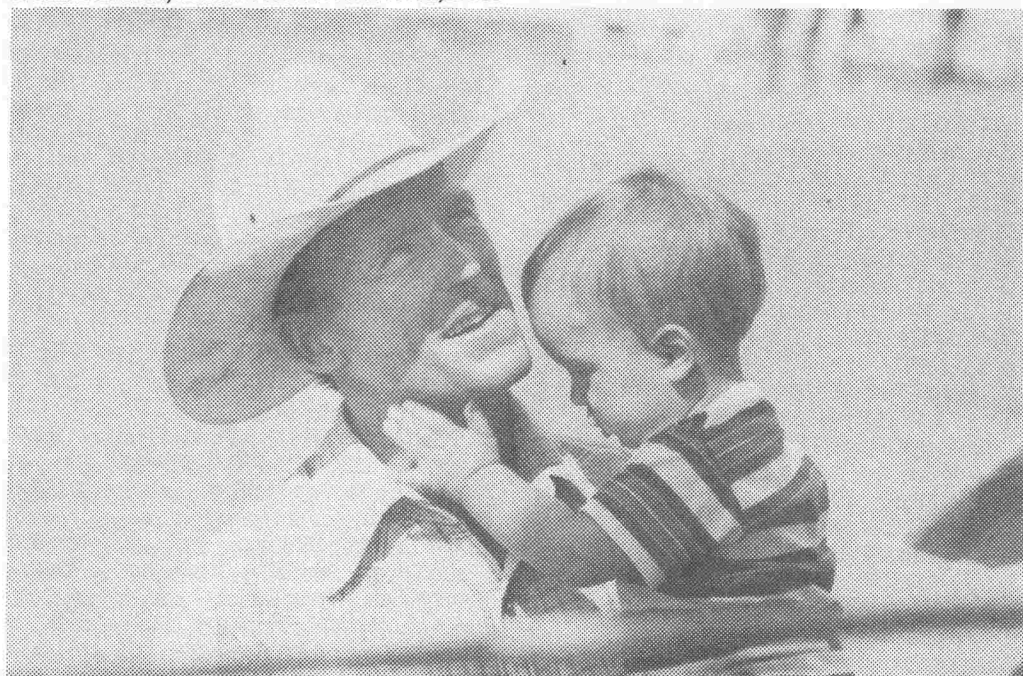

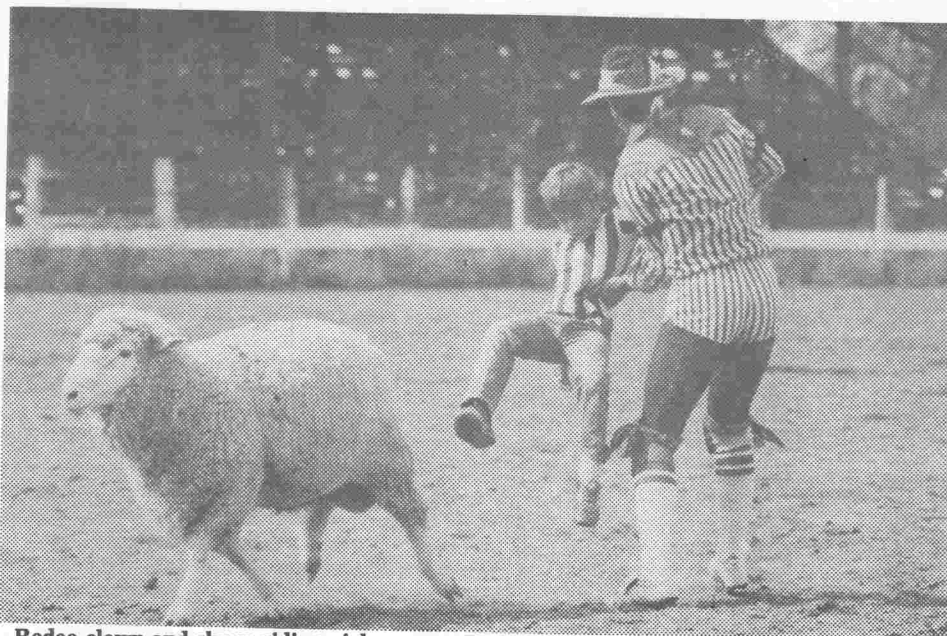

The Cans Have It!!

What do you check out when you first pull into a rodeo grounds? The riders check out the stock, the barrel racers check out the ground conditions, some look for stalls or pens for horses. Well, I check out the outhouses.

Rodeo, the number one sport has just one drawback as I see it — outhouses. You see, I'm addicted to sun tea or coffee, depending on the weather, and the outhouse seems an inevitable necessity. I have wondered how the connoisseurs of Coors handle the problem, which must be more severe than mine. Anyway, I've become a self-appointed expert on the subject of rodeo outhouses. I can tell you the location and the condition of every outhouse on the entire circuit.

First of all, there's the traditional — some are even bordering luxurious; the doors actually close all the way and you don't have to stuff your jacket in the holes between the boards to obtain any semblance of privacy. The traditional style is usually four feet by four feet with two holes cut in the bench inside. There are variations of course; some are painted, some have more than two holes in varying sizes to accommodate varying body types, and some actually have toilet paper holders.

Some of the more interesting types are the non-traditional. The East Helena women have a really deluxe model. It's relatively new with six compartments with individual doors for privacy. It's painted red with a newly shingled roof. The East Helena men, however, enjoy no such luxury. Their's is an enclosure of slatted boards of a little higher than shoulder height, with no roof. Passersby can clearly see the entire head of anyone using it. I've always wondered what to do when walking by. Right away I rejected the idea of waving, but do I speak and smile, discuss the weather, or cast my eyes to the ground and ignore the situation?

Three Forks has an interesting one. A couple of years ago I was there in the pouring rain. It is another of the roofless variety. I stepped inside to an array of rainbow colored toilet seats outlining the usual holes, but the TP was a soggy blob and the pouring rain insured a hasty job.

Winnett has an interesting set of outhouses. The men's is done in the traditional manner, complete with the half moon on the door. But on further inspection I noticed it was chained down to a rather healthy post set in the ground. I have to wonder if the concern is outhouse thieves or if there are mighty stiff winds

in the Winnett country. The women's has no worries about blowing away — it's set on a concrete pad. Evidently it has fallen victim to wind or vandals or something, because the door was completely disconnected from the hinges. The door was still there, and if one was skillful it could be propped up over the door opening, but this is rather difficult, especially from the inside. I decided it wasn't too important anyway, since the outhouse was located a good 2½ acres from the action. Unfortunately, that prairie provides an excellent place to warm up horses.

Roundup has real class. It has nice facilities under the grandstand or up beyond it, but just as a reminder of our pioneers it has a little white two-holer right outside the roping chutes. The door's always open and I heard various comments about it, but I don't think anyone ever uses it. I guess it's there as a tribute to Americana.

I thought after being at Butte last year, or Kalispell this spring, the ultimate answer to the outhouse problem was finally here — those little fiberglass jobs with the chemicals inside. I didn't even dread the trips to them. Until, naturally someone came along to ruin it all. She told me of a friend of hers who was inside one of them when some pranksters tipped it over, or was it, when the wind blew it over. At any rate it went over with her inside and the result is unprintable. Now I have a fear of fiberglass chemical biffies. There must be some scientific name for it — maybe "Johnphobia," or "Wee-hoosie-phobia."

Then there's the "Leaning Tower of Ennis" with rocks piled on the roof to keep it from blowing the rest of the way over.

Yea for Townsend. They have the very best facilities I've seen. Someone pointed out to me, however, that it is unfair to classify them with the rest because they are not actually outhouses in the western tradition. They are "in-houses" that are inside with doors and roofs and floors and flushers. I don't care about the classification. I like them.

Some of them have clever labels. There's the common, "Men" and "Women." But some have more imaginative designations. There's "Ladies" and "Gentlemen," "Cowgirls" and "Cowboys," and one says "Heifers" and "Bulls." That reminds me when we went out to eat at a local supper club when our youngest was just learning to read, she stood back and sounded out the words, then asked the obvious question any ranch-raised youngster would. "Where's the one for the steers?"

YE Rodeo Resounding Success

The 1983 Yellowstone Exhibition rodeo at Billings, the biggest paying rodeo in the NRA/MRA, was a resounding success with 560 contestants (682 entries) and a payoff of \$61,950 in the four-day, seven performance rodeo.

The rodeo was characterized by a record number of broken barriers, about 35 in all, and big crowds to catch the exciting action. There were, however, 34 turnouts.

Despite the pleas of contestants who beg to be up on the last day so their chances of winning are better, these statistics are interesting. The bareback riding was won on Monday night, the saddle bronc riding on Thursday night, the bull riding on Tuesday night (tied on

Thursday night), the team roping on Tuesday afternoon, the barrel racing on Wednesday night, the breakaway roping on Tuesday night, the calf roping on Wednesday night, and the steer wrestling on Thursday afternoon.

Complete results are published elsewhere in this issue, but individual champions at the YE were: bareback riding, Rod Sinclair; saddle bronc riding, Tom Wagoner; bull riding, Mike Lenning and Jim Leatherberry; team roping, Kirk and Dean Norell; barrel racing, Cinde Barthelmess; breakaway roping, Deb Haugland; calf roping, Danny Cross, and steer wrestling, Bruce Knight.

Those who attended the YE were impressed by the fine facilities, great horse races, night shows, free entertainment, classy midway, and the most attractive — the one-pay gate, making it possible for entire families to attend the fair at an affordable price, a feature many other fairs have adopted and one which should be considered by other large fairs in the state.

The Yellowstone County Commissioners, the Fair Board, and most of all, General Manger Bob Glasgow, are to be commended for a fine fair, a credit to the Billings area.

I know from experience that the intermission is the least desirable time. There's always a line a block long and I never consider going until it gets right near critical.

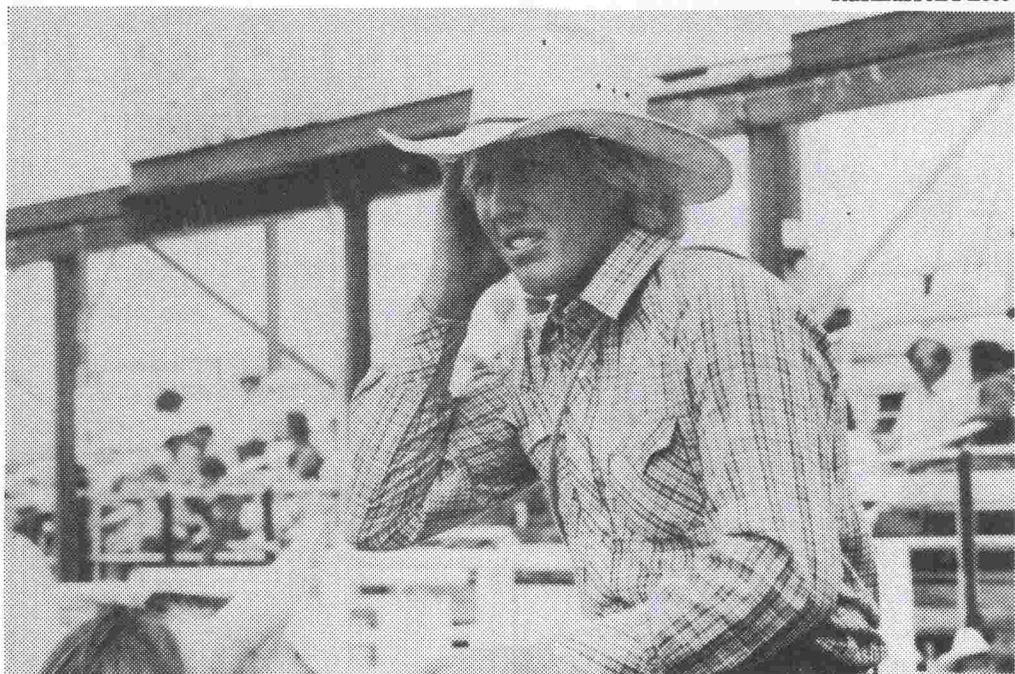

At least that's what I told my mother when she was horrified at the suggestion. I wonder if the trailer companies really know how versatile their products are. 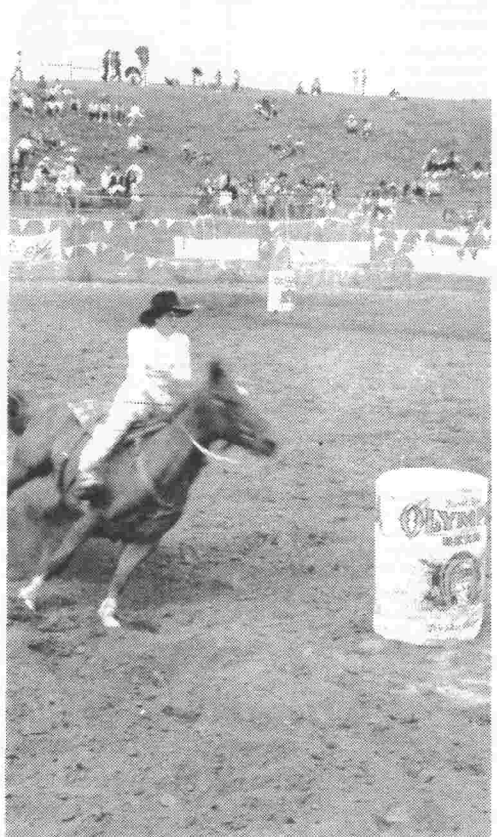

NARC Contestant Information

The 1983 Coors North American Finals Rodeo is just two months away. The Adolph Coors Company is again adding \$50,000 to be divided equally among the seven standard rodeo events.

Each member association is invited to send their top three contestants in bareback riding, calf roping, steer wrestling, saddle bronc riding, barrel racing and bull riding, along with their top three teams of team ropers to the Coors North American Finals Rodeo. (The NRA/MRA is eligible to send the top six)

The cut-off date for entries is Oct. 1, 1983. We ask that each association send their contestant list and entry fees to North American Finals Rodeo, P.O. Box 1024, Billings, Mont. 59103 on or before Oct. 10, 1983.

When you submit your contestant list, would you also send along a 3 x 5 card (typed) for each contestant in each event. Start the card at top left with the contestant name (last name first), top right with his or her event. Then add about a 25 word biography on his or her credentials, i.e., type of employment and rodeo awards, etc.

Entry fees will be \$100 U.S., per contestant with each association collecting their own entry fees and issuing one check to the North American Finals Rodeo.

When determining eligible contestants, an association must utilize contestant standings. Such standings shall be current as of the first of the month prior to the month in which the Coors North American Finals Rodeo is held, or the association's most current year-end standings. **Contestants must be chosen in listed order from one of the above for all events.** If a contestant chooses not to compete, the next in line shall be given the opportunity to do so. When submitting contestants names to NARC, the association shall also forward a copy of the standings which is to be at least 10 deep in each event. These lists shall also be used to select fill-ins if they are needed to complete entry slots left open by another association. No position shall be drawn for that association until this requirement is met. If contestant names do not follow that as shown on the standings, an explanation must be provided.

A contestant may represent more than one association at the Coors North American Finals Rodeo provided that such representation is in different events and the procedures of the preceding paragraph have been followed. In the event a contestant is within the top three in more than one association, a position will not be drawn for him until he declares which association he is representing in that event.

Associations will be allowed to submit changes on their list of contestants if original contestant selected should be unable to compete because of injury, etc. However, no changes can be made after 5 p.m. on Nov. 4, 1983 M.D.T.

After stock or position is drawn, secretary may not refund an entry fee without the approval of the judges or NARC Executive Board.

HORSE STALLS

Contestant horse barn is located on the west end of the Denver Coliseum. The coliseum is on the south side of I-70 and I-25 Interchange. The contestant horse barn contains 200 box stalls. The stall rent is \$25 for the week. This includes Zeolite 1010A for odor and ammonia absorption, a bale of straw, plus 24-hour security in the barn. When you check in you will be issued a leg band for your horse. The horse cannot leave the barn without the leg band on, and then only taken out by the contestant.

Contestant Check-in

Contestant check-in will be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Nov. 5, 1983 at the Denver Coliseum. Each contestant will be issued a packet of information and a numbered wrist band. Also, if you have a companion with you at check-in time, he or she will be issued a companion wrist band. There will be a special seating section set aside at either end of the coliseum for companions. Companions may enter the horse barn, but may not remove a horse from the coliseum.

Dress Code

When in arena during slack and/or paid performance, all contestants and rodeo personnel must be dressed in appropriate attire. This includes western hat, boots and trousers. A long-sleeved collared top must be worn. If it is of pull-over style, it must have a collar and long sleeves. No hooded sweatshirts allowed. Failure to comply with this rule may result in a disqualification and/or a fine. A disqualification will be levied by the judges and a fine by the NARC executive board.

North American Rodeo Commission

The Sixth Annual Coors North American Finals Rodeo will return to the Denver Coliseum Nov. 8-12, 1983.

The Adolph Coors Company will again be the primary sponsor. They will provide \$50,000 in prize money to be divided equally between the seven main events. Entry fees will be \$100 per event with the top three cowboys in each event from the 25 member associations invited to compete. (The NRA/MRA sends 6).

The tentative schedule of activities leading up to the finals is as follows:

Aug. 19 — NARC directors meet to select finals personnel.

Oct. 1 — Latest cut-off date for entries from each association.

Nov. 4 — Rodeo livestock arrives at the Denver Coliseum.

Nov. 5 — Cowboy check-in, rodeo stock is numbered and evening contestant meeting and social.

Nov. 6 — First go-round begins.

Nov. 7 — First go-round continues.

Nov. 8 — Tentative bucking horse and bull sale, second go-round begins in the evening, followed by cowboy dance at the Regency Hotel.

Nov. 9 — Tentative bucking horse and bull sale or jackpot timed events during the day, second go-round continues in the evening followed by a cowboy dance at the Regency Hotel.

Nov. 10 — Daytime jackpot timed events, second go-round continues in the evening, plus cowboy dance after the rodeo at the Regency Hotel.

Nov. 11 — Daytime jackpot timed events, second go-round continues in the evening followed by cowboy dance at the Regency Hotel.

Nov. 12 — 2 p.m. performance which will end the second go-round. There will be an 8 p.m. performance which will feature the top 12 in each event. The North American Champions will be crowned followed by a cowboy dance and party at the Regency Hotel.

Nov. 13 — Begin planning for the 1984 Coors North American Finals Rodeo.

Other activities planned for rodeo week in Denver include a western style show, tours of the Adolph Coors Company, shuttle buses to shopping centers and western stores.

The Regency Hotel (one mile from the Coliseum) will be the headquarters for the rodeo. They will provide a special rodeo rate of \$35 per night per room plus tax.

Plan now to attend the 1983 Coors North American Finals Rodeo. It will make a nice holiday, plus you will have the chance to see some of the best cowboys from three countries and the best rodeo livestock from about 20 stock contractors.

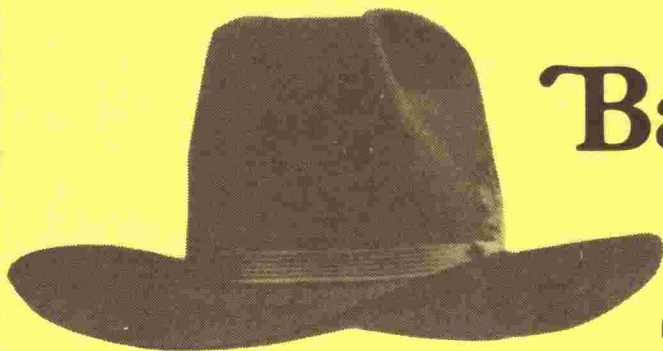
