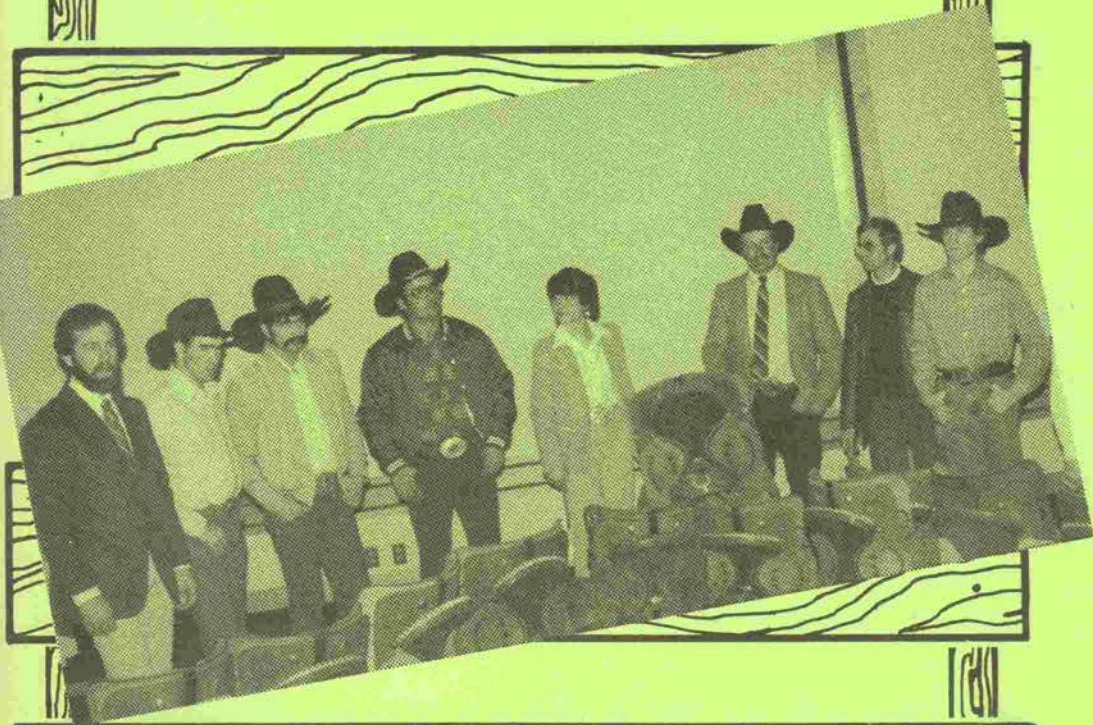

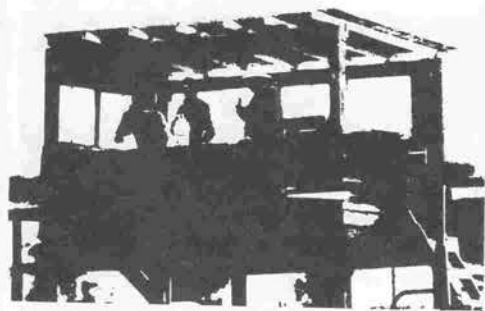

The annual Finals Issue always takes a little longer to compile and publish, but we're sure you'll think the wait was worth it. From now on through rodeo season, this publication will come out monthly. Keep this in mind when planning your advertising and remember... **PLAN AHEAD.** It takes a couple of weeks to get the NRA News printed and in the mail, and another week or two for it to get out to all the members and subscribers. This publication isn't like your daily paper where it happens today and is in print tomorrow. Keep a deadline of the 15th of each month in mind, however.

Blades of green grass peek hesitantly through the snowdrifts, "meadow muffins" and dead grass; gophers race madly from one side of the road to another, new calves, lambs and foals timidly explore their new life. New life and spring go hand in hand, and surely spring must be here. Can rodeo season be far behind?

The big talk during the NRA weekend was the recent court ruling that allows PRCA members to join the NRA and compete in their rodeos with no penalty. Everyone's anxious to bring rodeo in Montana back to just that, Montana rodeo. The majority of rodeo fans in Montana are not acquainted with that sometimes snobbish rodeo alphabet; all they care about is watching good rodeo. The burden rests upon the shoulders of the cowboys and cowgirls whose performances and behavior at Montana rodeos will prove to rodeo fans that they are among the most talented and versatile athletes in the world.

Watch further issues for more accurate rodeo listings and the traditional rodeo calendar in order to more accurately plan your summer. Pay your dues before April 15 and save \$10. Dues until that time are \$70 and after that are \$80. Not only that, you will save the NRA office a lot of added paperwork by getting it in early.

If you are one of the multitudes whose name appears on the suspended list, contact the NRA office and find out how you can negotiate your name off that dreaded "blacklist!" The NRA is anxious to pare that list and will work out a way for you to again compete in NRA rodeos. A two-page "blacklist" doesn't do much for the NRA's public image, so pass the word around and get the number of names down.

College and high school rodeo competitors are busy competing in their round of qualifying rodeos. Since many of these same competitors are also NRA members, watch for results and standings.

College National Finals scheduled again for Bozeman in June, and the Montana High School Rodeo Finals scheduled for Lewistown the end of June, will all be big rodeo highlights in the state. Remember, if you are a member of the National High School Rodeo Association, your NRA membership is offered to you at half price. See the membership application elsewhere in this issue.

NRA Conducts First Cowboy Auction

NRA cowboy, Curt Pate of Helena, who also happens to be a professional auctioneer with Pate Auction Service, organized and engineered the first cowboy auction ever held in conjunction with the NRA Finals, and it resulted in a lucrative deal, for both the successful buyers and the NRA.

Events auctioned off were the third go-around only of the saddle bronc riding, bull riding, barrel racing and team roping. Held during the annual cocktail party preceding the Saturday night performance. Pate was assisted in the auctioneering duties by Bullfighter of the Year, Kevin Hill.

Total payoff from the four events was \$6,980, and the NRA's percentage of the pot amounted to \$1,745. Pate generously donated his fee back to the NRA, which amounted to his being the donor of half of an event saddle.

The NRA extends its thanks to all those bidders who aided in bolstering the coffers of the NRA, while helping to fill their own pockets.

New Champs Named at 'Winter Happening'

The annual NRA Finals, "a real winter happening," opened Friday, Feb. 7 at the METRA in Billings, and when the curtain closed on Sunday, new champions had been crowned with a few surprises thrown in for good measure.

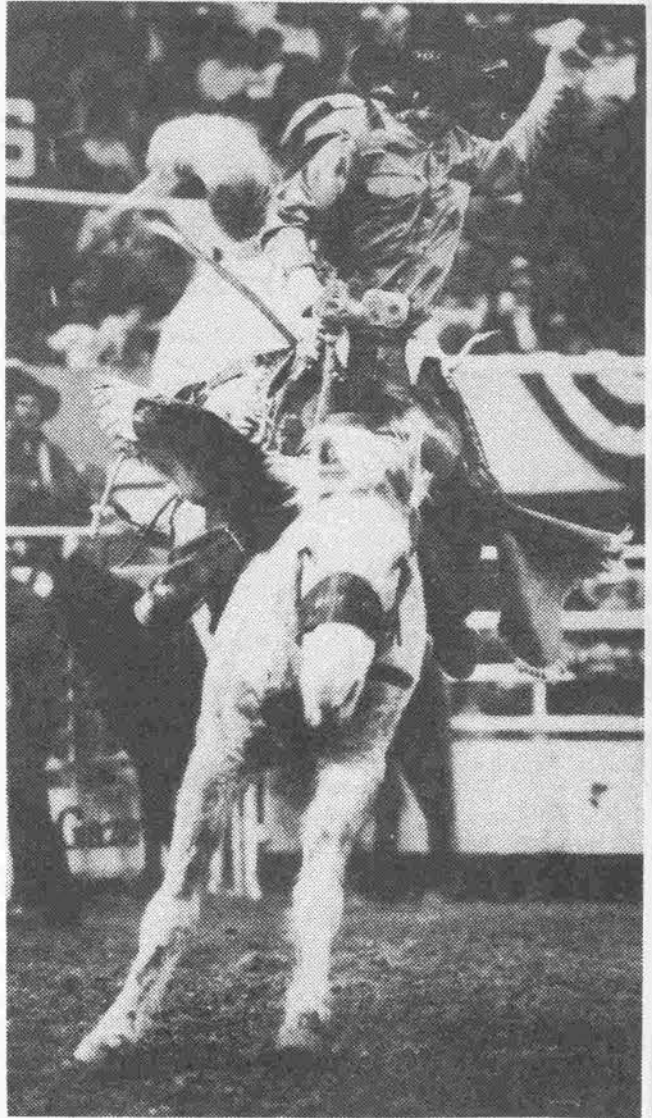
Attendance, estimated at close to 12,000 for the three performances was down this year, attributed to the adverse economic situation, not only in Montana, but particularly in the Billings area. Gross receipts were also down, but until the bills are all in, the financial statement seems to be about "a wash."

Promoter George Runquist and his right hand man, Bob Teaff made sure **everyone** in Billings and every Billings business knew about the rodeo, and they went all out welcoming the visitors to Billings for the annual shindig.

Frequently a contender, but never quite an all-around champion, Colin Murnion entered the NRA Finals with a \$1767.05 lead over perennial all-around cowboy, Bob Schall, and when the three day rodeo came to a close, Murnion had sewn up the 1985 all-around crown by winning a record amount of money. His total of \$11,522.47 surpassed the \$11,459 that Danny Cross won in 1983.

Lisa Scheffer entered the Finals with her fourth straight all-around title sewn up, and she added her second straight barrel racing title to boost her season total to \$6,788.36.

The biggest surprise came in the team roping, when NRA President Glen Hough made up a \$357.12 deficit and overtook leader, Richard Carpenter to capture his twelfth NRA team roping crown by \$9.83. Teamed at the Finals with his traditional partner, Phil Luman, the businesslike

Vo-Ag teacher, their times were not all that spectacular, but with the other ropers' problems they still placed third in the average and allowed Hough to win the year-end title by the slimmest of margins.

Last year's champion steer wrestler, Kent Mosher used a come-from-behind performance at the Finals to add

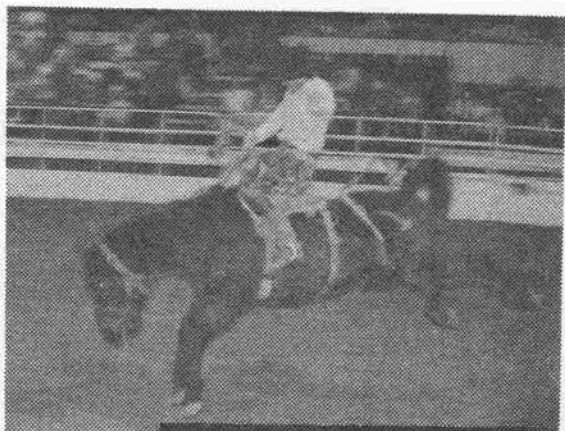
another championship to his collection, and pushed Rooster Reynolds to third. Richard Carpenter won the Finals average to move up in the final year-end standings to second place.

Individual average winners of the Finals were: bareback riding and bull riding, Colin Murnion; saddle bronc riding, Wayne Kelly; calf roping,

Danny Cross; steer wrestling, Richard Carpenter; team roping, Bill Lynn and Bill Ayre; breakaway roping, Kayleen Chaffee; barrel racing, Shantel Longwell.

Other year-end winners who were awarded their championship saddles at the annual awards banquet were: Bob Schall, bareback riding; Butch Reynolds, saddle bronc riding; Mike Barthelme, calf roping; Karleen Chaffee, breakaway roping; Tana Wilhelm, junior barrel racing and junior all-around and Bill Melany, junior breakaway roping.

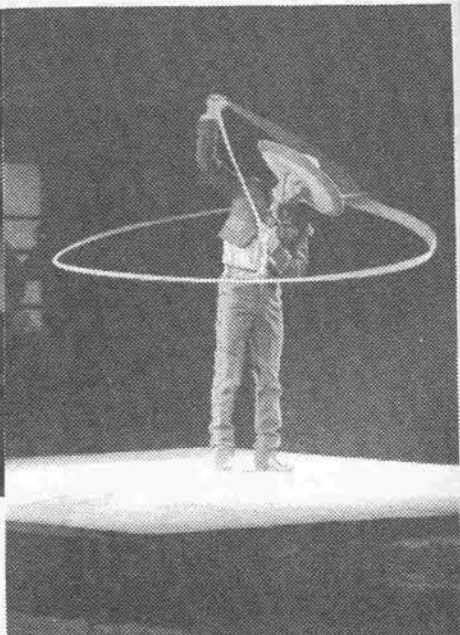
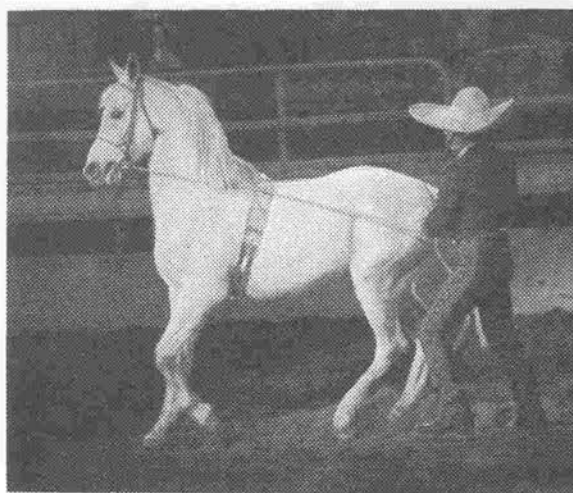

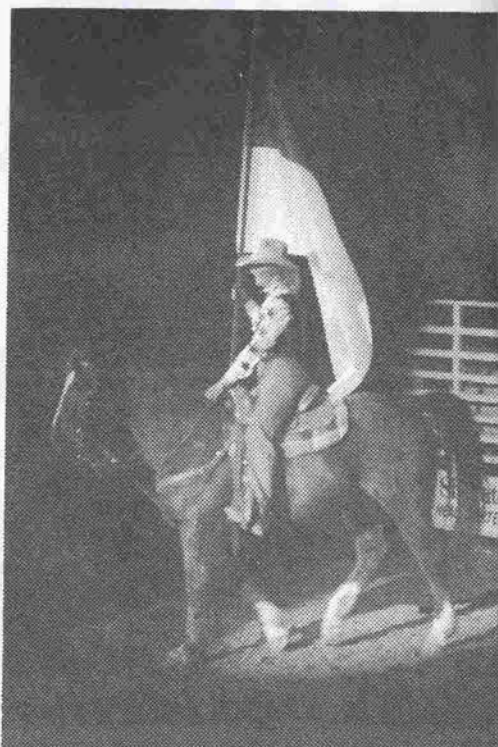


Remember when? Colin Murnion is awarded his 1977 championship saddle.



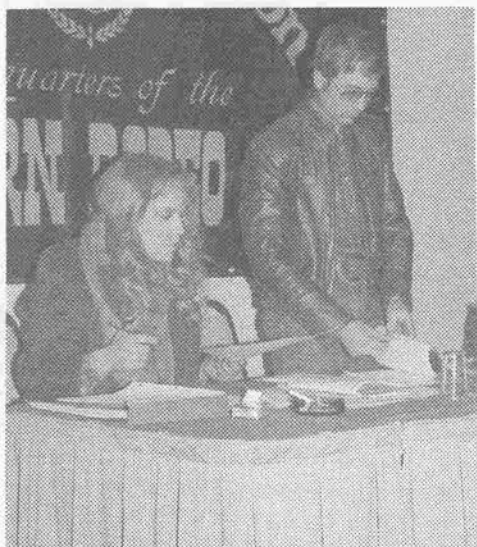

NRA Meetings Cover Lots of Ground

Published elsewhere in this issue are the minutes of the general membership and board of directors meetings, but for those of you who choose not to strain your eyes with such trivia, here are a few of the more important highlights.



NRA Secretary-Treasurer Jann Johnson and President Glen Hough are busy during the annual NRA meeting.

New directors elected by the membership each for two year terms are: calf roping, Mark Cain; ladies barrel racing, Sandi Nordahl; ladies breakaway roping, Cinde Barthelmess; saddle bronc riding, Buzz Cope; bareback riding, Joe Smith; West committee, Bob Gravely, Janet Endecott and Rodger Nordahl.

After being over \$100,000 in the red at this time last year, the North American Rodeo commission is now \$12,000 in the black, due to a successful NARC Finals and good fiscal management.

Members are urged to note these rule changes to take affect during the 1986 rodeo season.

The NRA permit system has been revised to allow purchase for \$35 as before, but competitor can win up to \$500 before purchasing a regular NRA membership. However, points won on the permit would count in the standings if accumulated in the same year. Price of the NRA card would cost the difference between the permit and the regular membership fee.

To encourage young people to participate in NRA rodeo, members of the National High School Rodeo Association have been granted

the option of purchasing a full NRA membership at half price.

Lengthy discussion ensued about the recent ruling allowing PRCA members to join other rodeo associations, and the general consensus of opinion was to welcome them into our association, whether as regular card holders or permit holders. Local committees who wish to restrict entries at their individual rodeos are urged to use their option of restricting their rodeo to "no permits accepted."

Price of regular NRA memberships were set as follows: \$70 if purchased before April 15; \$80 after April 15; \$35 for permits; \$15 for timer's and \$10 for junior membership.

Lengthy discussions and a committee meeting produced the following policy adopted on notified turn outs. If a member notifies the NRA office before 3 p.m. of the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo, and no stock was drawn, the member would be required to pay the fees plus a \$20 fine. If this \$20 is not paid within 3 working days after the rodeo, then the fine would be the fees plus the fees. Ordinary, no-shows would be treated as before, that is, fees plus fees.

As an incentive to the regular membership to get out and hustle year-end awards, it was voted to allow a member a 3 percent commission on any new NRA approved collected awards.

A couple of great cowboys who couldn't attend shared their experiences by letter, and these are printed later in the article.

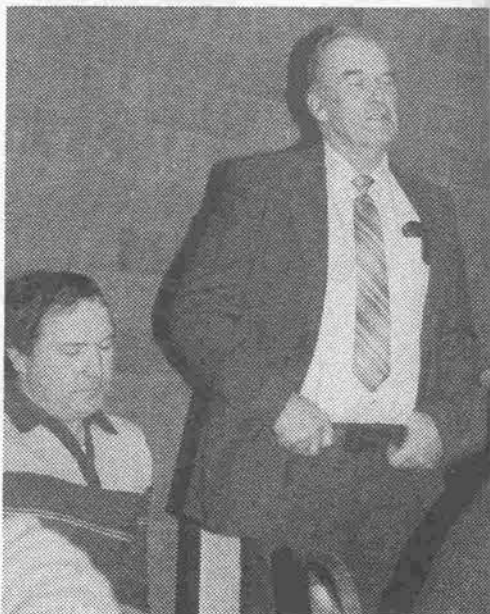


CONNIE COX

Many times all-around cowboy, Cox remembered the "good old times" and extended his appreciation to the NRA for organizing such an event, since he figured it only cost him \$150 for a free breakfast and to sneak into the rodeo.

Others speaking during the early morning event were Harry Dawson of Whitehall, president of the MRA from 1955 to '69; Larry Jordan Sr. of Roy; Dave Duffey, Ron Bohleen, Ed Waldhauser, Lois Hill, and finally present NRA President Glen Hough.

The past president and their spouses were seated in a special section of the METRA during the last performance of the Finals and were introduced during the rodeo.

Many who attended expressed hope that it would become an annual affair, and the NRA is working on this.

In 1953, the Montana Amateur Rodeo Association began under the leadership of Harry Dawson, who served until 1969. The association evolved into the Montana Rodeo Association, and the Northern Rodeo Association and

Thank you so much for the invitation. Would really like to come to the breakfast and rodeo. Just can't make it.

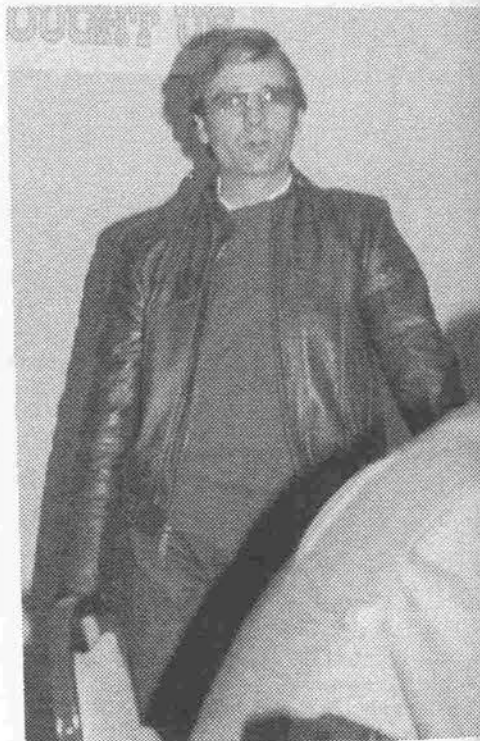
I will be in Arizona at that time or would certainly be there. Maybe, next year.

Trimmer Named 'Media Person of Year'

Unless you've been to Billings during an NRA rodeo and experienced first hand all the tremendous coverage given to the NRA by the Billings Gazette, chances are you've never met Dave Trimmer.

Named this year "NRA Media Person of the Year" during the annual awards banquet and also reaping part of the Coors awards for rodeo coverage, Trimmer makes himself known to nearly every NRA cowboy and captures their thoughts, feelings and personalities in words. The quiet, unassuming Miles City native has made NRA synonymous with rodeo in Billings, a feat not yet accomplished in any other Montana city.

On the following pages are parts of articles which appeared in the sports pages of the Gazette before, during and after the NRA Finals. They do not include the entire tabloid section which came out on Thursday before the Finals, titled simply "Rodeo." The tabloid wrapped up many years of rodeo in its 12 pages, crammed with a lot of rodeo and NRA statistics, background on rodeo personalities and the complete NRA Finals 3-day schedule.

Read up in the next few pages and discover as those who are connected with the "innards" of rodeo have, how Dave Trimmer has promoted your association more than you'll ever realize.

Murnion's Luck Holds at Finals

Colin Murnion wished everybody good luck, but it would have taken a lot more than that to wrest the Northern Rodeo Association all-around championship from the Jordan cowboy.

"Sometimes when you're in the lead, you look over your shoulder," he explained. "But I'm not competing against anyone but myself. I didn't watch everybody else but I wished everybody the best of luck."

Murnion won the bareback riding at the Finals with rides of 71 (third) and 76 (first) Friday and Saturday and capped the performance Sunday with a 77 (tied for first) on Dale Small's Featherweight Farah.

That sequence was worth \$1,395.

In bull riding, Murnion clinched the championship with rides of 73 (third) and 80 (first) the first two days and capped the event with a 74 Sunday to win the Finals.

And that sequence paid \$1,170.

His Finals winnings of \$2,565 pushed his season total to \$11,522.47, well ahead of defending champion Bob Schall, of Arlee, who won \$1,080 at the Finals for \$8,550.42.

"I figured if I would ride good, I should (have a good Finals) because a guy gets on good stock here," Murnion said. "I drew real good. In the horses, I had no arm jerkers, just nice ones. In the bulls, I couldn't beat it if I had drawn them out of the hat myself."

And the draw is "a good part of rodeo." Murnion said, "That's the secret to it. Anybody can ride the good ones. The key is to ride them arm jerkers and bad bulls. You can't do anything about the draw, so I learned not to worry. You have to make the most of the bad ones."

So the quest is finally over for Murnion, the 1977 bull riding champion and rookie of the year and top bareback rider in 1983.

"It's real important to me. That's what I set my sights on since 1977 or 78. I can't tell what I'm going to do. I'm going to go to a few big ones and cover a few of these around here. I can't really say what I'll do. This has been my goal so long, that's the main thing that kept me here."

Lisa Scheffer knows what she's going to do. "I'm going pro. Tomorrow," she said. "I'm going to start going down the road. I'm going to try anyway. If I can get things together, I'm going to Phoenix at the end of the month."

Her outstanding horse, Sorrely, is part of the reason she has dropped out of the University of Montana with three quarters remaining.

"Sorrely isn't getting any younger (15) and school will always be there," the defending collegiate all-around and barrel racing champion said.

Entering the Finals with the coveted all-around in her pocket didn't bother Scheffer.

"You want to do well. It's the top 10 of the state and to be competing against them is not easy."

It's just that she and Murnion made it look that way.



Hazer Has To Be Honest

It seems strange, that this fine line between winning and losing, where tenths of a second are measured in dollars, can be decided when competitors become teammates.

The sport is rodeo, the event is steer wrestling and it would be hard to find any other activity in organized competition that puts its participants in such contradicting positions.

The steer wrestling is the one trying to beat the clock but his chances would be slim without a hazer on the opposite side of the steer.

In a somewhat unique turn of events, many times that hazer is also entered in the bulldogging competition and finds himself trying to help the person that is trying to beat him.

"Basically, you're there to keep the steer running in a straight line," Augusta rancher Kent Mosher explained.

"If you're late, the steer is going to go to the right and the dogger isn't going to catch the steer or it will cost him a second or two. If you're early, the steer will go left and it will force the dogger to miss or cost him a second or two."

"It's a fine line. How good the steer wrestler does is how good a job the hazer does."

Mosher enters the Northern Rodeo Association Finals at METRA beginning tonight at 8 as the defending steer wrestling champion. He is also considered one of the best, if not the best, hazers. He figures to haze for at least three other cowboys during the Finals.

"A hazer has to know the steers, too, as well as the dogger," Mosher said. "Some go hard, some slow. They have different speeds, different styles. A hazer has to know, just like the dogger gets to know which steers have different traits."

Mosher hauls two horses to rodeos and anytime a horseless cowboy asks to borrow his doggin' horse, Mosher hazes. If the cowboy places in the money on a borrowed horse, the owner gets 1/8 of the winnings, as does the hazer. With that incentive, hazers do an honest job.

"You try to do your best," Mosher said. "For one thing, someday that guy might be hazing for you. You're not going to be out there and try to be late on purpose. Someday, that might happen to you. Besides that, you get paid."

"If you do mess up, you say you're sorry. You do the best you can do. You're only human and there are going to be human errors."

"But it's a good feeling when you know you've done a good job for somebody."

A couple of times, at out-of-state rodeos, Mosher had to ask a stranger to be his hazer and traditional sportsmanship was ignored.

"I had it happen to me once or twice. I learned my lesson pretty fast. I'd rather have somebody not as good that is at least honest. You very seldom see it and everybody knows it. Too many guys know what's going on, not only the guy he's hazing for but the guys sitting back watching."

As for the two horses involved, often belonging to the same cowboy, Mosher said, "Some horses aren't fast enough or good enough for hazing. You have to have a horse go at the same rate of speed as the steer. A horse can go faster but once he gets up equal, he has to rate back into the same speed. Very few horses can do both. Doggin' horses are trained to run up and run by real fast."

Mosher himself has been going pretty fast, having finished second in the Montana Pro Rodeo steer wrestling standings for the 1985 after placing third in their Finals last month in Great Falls. So far this year he has gone to major PRCA rodeos in Denver and Fort Worth and is planning to make Houston.

"I'm constantly going to a few less rodeos but a few better rodeos. I have work at home to do. I'd like to go to them all but I can't. I'll try to go to other close rodeos that pay the best and try to break even."



Notso Bad for Miller at Finals

Karen Miller, Notso bad.

The Absarokee cowgirl tightened up the breakaway roping race at the Northern Rodeo Association Finals Saturday night by placing third with a 4.46. That was worth \$180 and combined with her first-place effort of Friday, Miller enters Sunday's 2 p.m. finale at METRA less than \$500 behind leader Kayleen Chaffee.

That's not too bad for the 42-year-old school teacher, who failed to make the Finals the past two years and is riding a new horse this year.

Still, she's not counting on making up the difference on Chaffee, a Billings cowgirl who is sitting third in the average behind Miller and Cinde Barthelmiss.

"I've never caught three in a row, so I'm not counting the average," Miller said, only half joking.

She bought her horse at a sale and "Wonderful" wasn't even broke. That prompted the Miller name of "Notso."

He rode him on the ranch and Ed (her hus-

band) said he was an awfully good horse. I kept riding him and he got better and better. We went a weekend at a time."

Two years ago, Miller planned to retire but she took her son, Matt, now 17, to junior rodeos. Last year, she struggled riding her old horse. But the 1985 season saw her back in serious competition, something she missed the previous two years.

"It's a family deal. Ed was a bull dogger. Now him and Matt team rope."

The key for Miller making the Finals was \$900-plus Labor Day, which allowed her to enter the Finals in fourth place with \$2,321, just over \$1,000 behind Chaffee. Miller found a place to practice and now is in second place.

"We (Janie Carlson) went to Woolsley's at Wilsall and roped two weekends. She's a good roper, intimidating. She doesn't miss in practice or much in rodeos." Carlson entered the Finals just behind Miller.

"Now I'm just going to ride up into position and hope my rope is ready when it's time," Miller said. "Glen Hough (a team roper) taught me that."

Hough Surprises Self

That's because Hough completed his first year as Northern Rodeo Association president by winning the team roping championship by \$9.83.

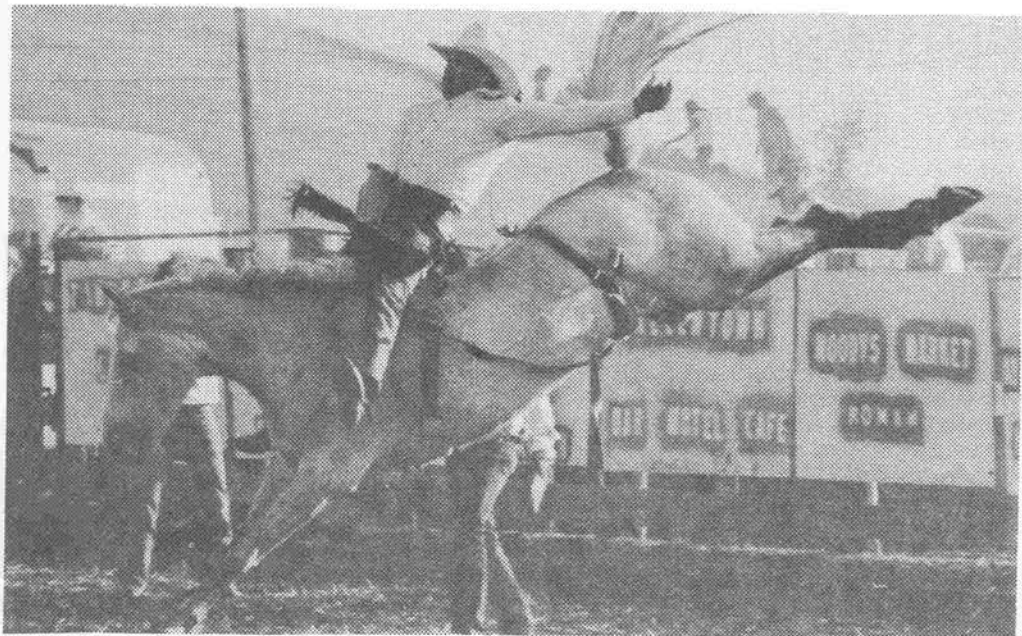
Hough, from Shepherd, won his 12th NRA team roping crown but he said, "Winning never gets old."

"It happens once in a while if you go to enough rodeos," Hough said. "Somebody is smiling on you. I wouldn't give it back. Some times I thought I should win and didn't. What goes around comes around. It was just my turn."

Jerry Chrisman Victim of Flood

Jerry Chrisman, 39, of Conrad was a victim of a flash flood when he tried to drive his van across a washed-out bridge approach on the Dry Fork of the Marias River two miles north of Conrad, Feb. 25, 1986.

The turbulent waters carried the van approximately 438 feet downstream before it came to rest. He died before search and rescue teams and ambulance crew could extricate him from the van and put him aboard the Mercy Flight helicopter from Deaconess Medical Center in Great Falls.

A chinook wind in the area had melted about two feet of snow overnight, creating raging torrents in otherwise dry coulees.

Chrisman, owner of Chrisman Carpet Service in Conrad was born Nov. 23, 1946 in Alexandria, Minn. He moved with his family to Great Falls in 1952, attended schools there and graduated from Great Falls High School in 1965. During high school he was a member of the National High School Rodeo Bareback Riding Championship in 1964. He entered the U.S. Army and served from 1966-67. Following his discharge, he attended Northern Montana College where he began following his father's trade of carpet layer to work his way through school. He continued rodeo riding and won the Montana Summer Circuit of the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association Bareback events

in 1975-76. In addition, Jerry won the Montana Pro Rodeo Bareback event in 1976 and was a member of the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association.

Chrisman ended up in the top 10 in the year-end NRA bareback riding at least five different times and in recent years had turned his attention to judging. At the time of the accident he was returning to his Conrad home after helping his friend, Dan Majerus move his cattle to higher ground from approaching flood waters caused by rapidly melting snow.

Chrisman finished fourth in the bareback riding standings in 1971, ninth in 1972, sixth in 1973, third in 1974, and after a stint with the PRCA, he returned to the NRA and ended up eighth in the standings in 1979.

He married Marcia Williamson in Great Falls, July 20, 1985.

He was preceded in death by his father, Sheldon Chrisman in 1972. Survivors include his mother, Alene Newmiller, Great Falls, his wife, Marcia, a daughter, Tana Chrisman, a son, Shad, a stepdaughter, Tammara Williamson, all of Conrad; two brothers, Chuck, Great Falls and Frank, Portland, Ore.; five sisters, Charlene Wilson, Idaho, Judy Powell, Missoula, Patsy Lingsheit, Great Falls, Shelley Loney, Highwood and Bobby Jo Chrisman, Great Falls and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

NRA Awards Director, a non-voting position, responsible to the Vice President, and all expenses incurred must first be approved through the NRA office. Ed Waldhauser, second. Passed unanimously.

Notified Turn-outs at rodeos was addressed. Much discussion. Contestants feel that the fining procedure should be reconsidered and restructured for "Notified Turn-outs" and handled in a different manner than a non-notified turn-out. Skeeter Nordahl moved: If a contestant notifies the NRA Office before 3 p.m. on the last working day before the first performance of the given rodeo, the contestant is responsible for their fees in all events entered, plus a \$20 fine per contestant, not event. Each individual rodeo secretary must call the NRA office between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. on the last working day before the first performance of their rodeo to receive their list of notified turn-outs for their rodeo. Mark Cain, seconded. Passed.

Bill Davis moved: Entry fees must be paid by the end of the last performance the contestant competes in, or he will be subject to a \$20 fine plus his fees. Restitution must be made to the NRA Office within three working days after that performance or the fine becomes fees plus the fees. Lois Hill, second. Passed unanimously.

Discussion continued on the current awards program. Suggestion was made that a percentage should be paid to those who do get awards donated. Bill Davis moved: Based on the cost of the award, a 3% commission be paid to the individual on all new, collected, board approved, awards sponsorship. Lois Hill, seconded. Passed.

The Finals payoff was discussed. The possibility of raising the entry fees was addressed. Board recommendation was that entry fees remain the same, \$100 per event.

Judging clinics: two judging clinics/seminars will be held before the 1986 rodeo season begins.

Discussion regarding the "official" publication of the NRA. Howard Holloway moved: The Northern Rodeo Association will retain the NRA News, published by Stan and Tootie Rasmussen. Skeeter Nordahl, seconded. Passed.

The suggestion was made regarding time event box pads that could be carried by each stock contractor and used at their rodeos. Will be looked into.

Skeeter Nordahl moved: In the rough stock events at all NRA rodeos, one judge will carry a stop watch. Bill Stovall, seconded. Passed.

Meeting adjourned.

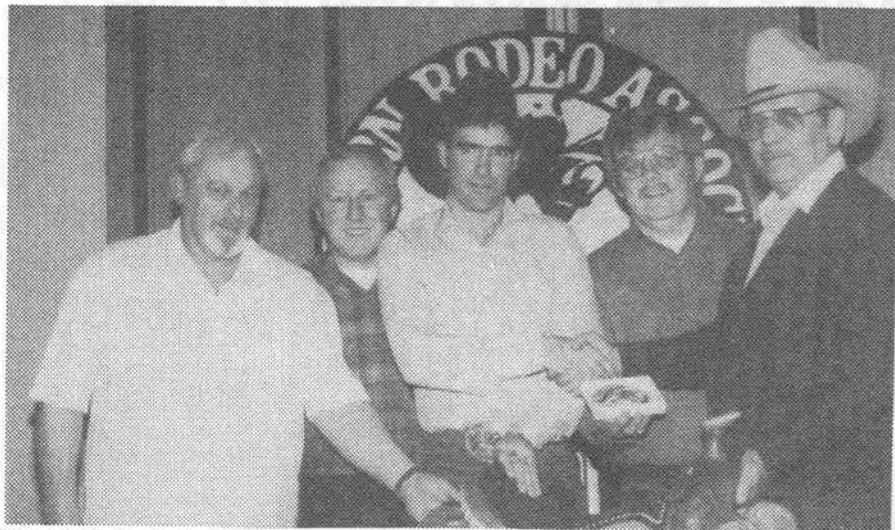

Spur Serves Good Eats Cowboy Style

The Spur Bar and Chuckwagon Cafe, 1203 First Ave. N., isn't fancy, but you won't find better steaks for lower prices anywhere else in town.

For nearly 25 years, the Spur has catered to truckers, ranchers and cowboys. It has changed "not a bit" since George Hall, Buzz Buzzelli and Jerry Weitz took over in 1982, co-owner and bartender Weitz said. "It's kind of a nostalgic old place," he said.

Large black and white prints of cowboys decorate the walls. One 1930 scene by Charlie J. Belden shows a bunkhouse card game in progress on the Pitchfork Ranch near Meeteetse, Wyo.

A former Nash dealership, the building was converted to a bar and cafe in 1961. The first Spur owner installed lanterns from his ranch in the new business. They're still lighting the place.

Entertaining relatives from the Midwest recently, I took my visitors to the Spur and Chuckwagon for a look at a "cowboy bar."

The cafe was uncrowded on that midweek night when we were served cold beer and juicy steaks. It was a much better taste of Montana than the rowdy Old West bar I'd imagined.

On a return trip for dinner at the Chuckwagon, I again found fast, friendly service and hot food.

We were seated right away in an orange vinyl-covered booth. The rustic lanterns provided most of the light in the large dining

room. Easy country music played from a speaker.

A cocktail waitress appeared a minute or two after we sat down and returned with our beers two minutes later. The price was a dollar each for ice cold brew served in bottles.

Wine and mixed drinks also are served here.

Dinners at the Chuckwagon include soup, a saucersized relish tray, tossed salad, potato, Texas toast and ice cream or sherbet for dessert.

Slushy, winter cold outside made the hot and hearty homemade cup of soup a great beginning for this meal. The soup was a tomato and beef broth chock-full of tender, lean beef chunks and elbow macaroni,

I was still eating crisp lettuce salad when our steaks arrived. No matter, the food stayed hot.

My New York cut steak was cooked a shade beyond the "medium" I ordered, but still tender. My husband's choice T-bone was a big steak that he rated "good."

With an order of sauteed mushrooms, our dinner tab totaled \$19.50, reasonable price for a lot of good food.

I highly recommend the filet mignon, which I ordered on a previous visit. It's served with mushrooms for \$8.25.

The Chuckwagon dinner menu features steaks ranging, in price from \$5.25 to \$10.75. Other selections include french fried shrimp for \$7.25, broiled lobster tails for \$18, prime rib for \$7.75 and Rocky Mountain oysters - a house specialty for \$4.50. A sandwich menu lists burgers starting at \$1.50.

1986 RULE CHANGES

Page 20 or 21

1. If a contestant shows up to compete on a day other than the day they are actually up on according to the rodeo secretary, before competing in that rodeo, the contestant must post a bond in the amount of \$100. If, after verification with central entry the contestant was correct, the bond will be refunded. If the contestant was in error, the bond (fine) will be forfeited, contestant suspended, contestant's fees figured in the payoff and the proper payoff will be paid out disregarding said contestant's placing.

Page 9

2. All meetings attended by a representative for the NRA must be previously approved by the president or vice president and that \$.20 per mile be paid to the representative for travel and other previously approved expenses will be reimbursed to the individual.

Page 16

3. There will be no ground split money (and the current ground split rule be deleted) the money will be paid to the contestants who have qualified in the event and the points will count towards the NRA standings. All monies will be split according to the number of contestants qualified and percentages for those numbers may be found in the day money payoff. (Delete old rule, page 15).

Page 6

4. A contestant may purchase a permit to compete at all rodeos which accept permits until \$500 is won. The permit holder's points will count toward year-end standings. After the \$500 money won limit is reached, a card must be purchased. Price of card to be the dollar difference between the cost of a permit and the cost of a card. However, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the finals rodeo. The \$500 money limit will be accumulated from year to year, allowing the contestant to purchase a permit each year until \$500 is won.

5. Any current national high school rodeo association member in good standing may purchase an NRA membership at 1/2 regular card price.

6. \$2 be collected from every barrel racing contestant at each rodeo for the electric eye, if the electric eye fails to work and hand times are used, the \$2 is to go into an electric eye fund, to be used towards replacement or repair of the electric eyes.
